	Provider has current email address.
	Provider is at least 18 years of age.
	Provider is only caring for a child or children that live in the home where care is being provided. (An In-
	Home provider is an individual who provides child care services in the child or children(s) own home.)
	Have a working telephone capable of receiving incoming and making outgoing calls that is
	available at all times in the home in which care is being provided.
	Verification of current State Fire Marshal approval.
	Criminal Background check (CBC) for the provider, all adults employed in the home and on the
	property, and all non-caregiver adults living in the home where care is provided.
	Current certification in infant, child and adult CPR.
	Current partification in padiatria first aid
	Current certification in pediatric first aid.
	Orientation training (must be completed within six months of initial certification)
	Annual Training of 12 clock hours in job-related subject areas approved by the department.
	If transportation is provided, the provider shall use child safety restraints required by law, take
-	precautions necessary to ensure the safety of children being transported, and develop
	emergency procedures and actions to be taken in the event of an accident or breakdown.
	Written permission from a parent to administer medication to a child in care.
	Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and
	chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils are in a secure place that is inaccessible to children
	Identify and protect children from safety hazards in the home and on the premises, such as
-	uncovered electrical outlets, strings and cords, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic.
	Have appropriate emergency phone numbers, such as fire and police, hospitals and Louisiana
	Poison Control, and the physical address and phone number for the home in which care is
	provided posted in a prominent, easily visible location, and have a written emergency plan that
	protects children in the event of fire, flood, storm, hurricane, tornado, and snow and ice.
	Maintain first aid supplies in the home where sare is provided
	Maintain first aid supplies in the home where care is provided.
	Allow inspection of the home where care is provided by department staff and other authorized
	inspection personnel and parents of children in care, during normal working hours and when
	children are in care.
