School System Support & Planning

Louisiana School Improvement

The Department is committed to ensuring all students access on-grade level instruction every day.

To achieve this goal, the Department will support school systems in two ways:

1. School System Plan Implementation

Department Focus: Supporting Comprehensive Intervention Required (CIR) schools to implement plans.

2. School System Planning for 2019-2020

Department Focus: Facilitating an improved 2019-2020 school system planning process focused on schools identified as Urgent Intervention Required (UIR).

School Improvement Support: Implementation of School System Plans

The school system planning process is focused on ensuring that 100 percent of teachers are implementing a high quality curriculum and that 100 percent of classrooms are led by a qualified teacher.

To accomplish this goal, the Department will support school systems in three phases.

Phase	Purpose
Pre-Implementation (Summer)	Ensure that all materials and professional development calendars are in place for the start of the new school year. Remove low-quality materials from classrooms.
Early Support (Fall)	Observe classrooms to determine what additional support and professional development teachers need to help them use their curriculum effectively.
Deep Support (Spring)	Provide for concentrated and comprehensive support for schools that need additional help with implementation.



School System Plan Implementation: Early Support Update

During the Early Support phase, network teams will conduct school site visits where they will review school-level data and observe classrooms to ensure:

- teachers have access to curriculum materials and students are using them;
- teachers are using the curriculum as intended; and
- students are engaging deeply with the content.

To accomplish this, network teams will use [Curriculum Implementation Observation tools](#) and it is recommended that school leaders in CIR schools review these tools in advance of the site visits.

Lastly, be on the lookout for a communication from your network team to set up your site visit.



School System Planning for 2019-2020

2019-2020 school system planning will focus in two areas:

- 1) Release of new school system planning application process**
 - 2) Development of Urgent Intervention Required (UIR) plans**
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More information about school system planning for 2019-2020 will be shared at the November collaborations.





School System Planning for 2019-2020

In November, the Department will launch an improved school system planning process:

- School systems will build one plan across the priorities outlined in the District Planning Rubric which is a modified version of the School Redesign Rubric
- School systems will develop a budget to support that plan including both federal formula and competitive funds
- School systems will submit and receive approval of their plan and funding request on one unified timeline
- School systems will implement the plan in partnership with the Networks in 2019-2020



2019-2020 School System Planning: UIR Update

The second focus for 2019-2020 planning is the development of school system plans for persistently struggling schools that meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Consistently **low subgroup performance*** → Urgent Intervention Required (UIR)
- Chronic issues with **student behavior** → Urgent Intervention Required (UIR)
- Consistently **low overall performance or grad rate** → Comprehensive Intervention Required (CIR)

Any school that meets these criteria will be required to make a plan. The UIR and CIR school list will be shared after letter grades are released.

Stay tuned for more information about UIR planning at the November Collaborations.

* A subgroup is defined as a minimum of 10 students in any of the following groups: major racial and ethnic groups, economically-disadvantaged, students with disabilities, and English learners.



Early Childhood Assessments:

Using *GOLD*® in 2018-2019, Support and Resources

For the 2018-2019 school year, all users in Louisiana will be under one *GOLD*® license and will have one set of login credentials. Within that single license, the Department is providing flexibility for sites to choose an item set that meets the needs of the site.



Sites can choose one of three options for completing checkpoints:

- Use a default list of 70 percent of *GOLD*® items that meets all requirements
- Follow specific instructions to complete an abbreviated checkpoint ([AB1](#) or [AB2](#))
- Add additional items beyond the 70 percent in order to complete a checkpoint using up to the full set of objectives offered

TeachingStrategies GOLD® has created a set of resources to help [teachers](#) and [administrators](#) make a smooth transition into these changes.



Using CLASS® for Compass in 2018-2019

School systems are encouraged to use *CLASS*® as the rubric for evaluating professional practice of public school pre-K teachers in all or some of their schools.

School systems that choose to use *CLASS*® as the Teacher Professional Practice Rubric for public school pre-K teachers for 2018-2019 must complete the waiver and return to compass@la.gov by September 30.

- Early Childhood Community Network lead agencies are required to develop and follow a local protocol for conducting *CLASS*® observations.

1. Teachers have access to curriculum materials and students are using them.
2. Teachers are using the curriculum as intended.
3. Students are engaging appropriately with the content.

Units 1 and 2 of the [Grade 7 Companion Document](#) have been posted to the [K-12 Social Studies Resource Library](#) and the [Grades 6-8 Social Studies Teacher Library](#). The full document will be posted later in the fall.

A note about the Grade 8 Companion Document: Based on teacher feedback and in the interest of better aligning to the shifts in social studies, the Department recommends a reorganization of content in the [Updated Scope and Sequence](#). This companion document suggests a method for integrating geography, civics, and economics GLEs into each unit (as opposed to only unit 6). See page 4 of the [Grade 8 Companion Document](#) for an updated sequence for teaching instructional tasks.



Science: Middle School Curriculum Pilot

During the summer, 250 middle school teachers received training on units from a high quality science curriculum currently under development, [OpenSciEd](#). Additional teachers will have the opportunity to receive training on and pilot the units in late fall.

- support the implementation of a statewide competitive grant process using federal funds annually allocated to school redesign.

Believe and Prepare: Resident and Mentor Stipends

In October 2016, BESE approved a three-year transitional funding package to support the transition to new teacher preparation guidelines, which includes a yearlong residency.

Funding includes a **\$2,000 stipend for undergraduate residents** participating in a yearlong residency and a **\$1,000 stipend for mentors of undergraduate residents**.

The Department is running a data collection process to allocate funding to school systems with undergraduate residents. School systems with year long undergraduate residents were able to access their partially completed data file through the FTP on August 27.

The deadline for school systems to upload their completed file is **this Friday, September 7 at 3:00 p.m.** Further details about the data collection process are [available](#) to assist with questions.

Compass Information System (CIS) Close Out

August 17: VAM scores were released in CIS.

September 7 (5:00 p.m.):

- All SLT and Compass Evaluation scores must be entered into CIS.
- CIS will rollover and schools will no longer be able to enter or delete data from 2017-2018.

September 11:

- CIS will be ready for new roster entry for the 2018-2019 school year.
- All schools must remove any employees leaving the school from CIS.
- 2017-2018 finalized evaluation scores will be visible.

The Louisiana Department of Education recognizes that great teachers and school leaders are critical to student success. Annually, the Department honors some of the state's most successful educators through the Louisiana Teacher and Principal of the Year programs.

Part of the [selection process](#) for naming the school system and state-level winners includes recommendations from teachers, principals, school system employees, parents, colleagues, and community members.

Anyone wanting to submit a nomination may do so. Self-nominations and multiple nominations are also accepted.

Outstanding candidates are those who:

- Demonstrate excellence in the field, guiding students of all backgrounds and abilities to achieve excellence.
- Demonstrate leadership and innovation in and outside of the classroom walls that embodies lifelong learning.
- Collaborate with colleagues, students, and families to create a school culture of respect and success.

Nominations must be submitted via the [nominations portal](#) by September 28.

The portal may also be accessed by visiting the [Department's website](#). Nominations will be sent to the local school systems for consideration as they select their top candidates to participate in the state-level process.




Communicating 2018 School Performance Scores

The Department is committed to supporting school system and school leaders in communicating the 2018 school performance scores, and new student progress measure, to families and communities.

At the September Supervisor Collaborations, the Department will provide school system leaders with a toolkit of resources to support these conversations that includes:

- **Training presentation for principals** to help them prepare for the fall release;
- **Customizable presentation** for communicating this year's school system and school performance scores, and Comprehensive and Targeted Intervention designations
- **Social media and website graphics** celebrating school growth and Top Gains schools
- **Louisiana Accountability System and Louisiana School Finder flyers** for families
- **Animated videos** explaining school performance scores, including the new "Student Progress" Index



Measuring Results: 2018-2019 Assessment Administration



LEAP Connector Eligibility

The Every Student Succeeds Act requires states to ensure that only students with the most significant disabilities take the LEAP Connect alternate assessment.

To this end, the Department has released enhancements to the special education reporting system (SER), with [guidance](#), to make certain school systems verify students meet the existing state participation criteria.

- For any student who will participate in the Spring 2019 LEAP Connect alternate assessment, **school systems must add qualifying cognitive and/or adaptive assessment results to verify eligibility in SER by January 4, 2019.**
- Students will not be able to participate in the LEAP Connect alternate assessment in Spring 2019 unless eligibility is verified. They will participate in regular statewide assessments.
