

# Credentials Matrix

<b>Statewide Credentials</b>	All statewide credentials are indicated on the Statewide IBC Focus List published periodically by the Workforce Investment Council (WIC). The most updated IBC Focus List can be found on the <i>All Things Jump Start</i> web portal.
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<b>833 Pathways</b>	Students graduating using an Act 833-Eligible Students graduation pathway must attain the culminating credentials indicated as appropriate by the student's IEP team.
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<b>Complementary Credentials</b> <b>All Integrated and Regional graduation pathways include the following Complementary credentials</b>	
<b>Recommended Safety Complementary Credentials</b>	1) Basic Safety Orientation - Association of Reciprocal Safety Councils 2) First Aid for Students Certification - Red Cross or approved equivalent* 3) OSHA 10 – General Industry - OSHA Certificate of Completion 4) OSHA 10 – Construction - OSHA Certificate of Completion * - all First Aid certifications must include CPR and AED. To give districts and charter schools maximum flexibility to comply with the First Aid requirements of HB 542, districts and charter schools can provide the Jump Start team with evidence that the First Aid certification they're using includes all required components as well as a practical certification.
<i>Students may apply only one Safety Complementary Credential towards their Jump Start graduation requirements</i>	
<b>Recommended Computer Literacy Complementary Credentials</b>	5) Internet and Computing Core Certification (IC <sup>3</sup> ) – Certiport 6) Microsoft Excel Specialist – Microsoft and Certiport 7) Microsoft PowerPoint Specialist – Microsoft and Certiport 8) Microsoft Word Specialist – Microsoft and Certiport 9) Microsoft Office Specialist Other – Microsoft and Certiport
<b>Approved (But <i>Not</i> Recommended) Complementary Credential</b>	10) QuickBooks – Certiport (issue: this is a very demanding credential; students are encouraged to attain this credential, but it will be significantly more challenging to attain than the recommended Complementary credentials)
<b>OSHA Credentials</b>	Many OSHA credentials will not be recognized as Jump Start complementary credentials. Please see the Jump Start Policy Regarding OSHA Courses / Credentials (available for download from the <i>All Things Jump Start</i> website) for additional details
