

PARTNER PREVIEW GUIDE

The Louisiana Department of Education Is hosting a School Redesign Summit on January 19, 2017. This Summit is an opportunity for local district and school leaders to meet with proven partners who have demonstrated success in improving student performance from across Louisiana and across the country. Under the Every Student Succeeds Act, districts will be required to build improvement plans for each of their struggling schools and the Summit will provide an opportunity for districts to brainstorm strategies for their schools. Over fifty organizations applied to attend the Summit and the Department invited 47. In order to help districts identify the partners with whom they would most like to meet, each partner has been categorized into one of the three following categories:

- Operator Organizations which directly manage the function of the school, bringing in a new model of operation.
- Whole School Design Organizations which provide a full range of services designed to enhance all aspects of a school's operation.
- Specialized Support Organizations which provide technical assistance on specific aspects of a school's operation.

Below are brief summaries, sorted in to the categories shown above, provided by potential partners selected to attend the School Redesign Summit. The full RFI response from each provider can be viewed on our website <u>here</u>.

OPERATOR

GEO Foundation

GEO Foundation can provide direction on staff recruitment, development, curriculum, budgeting, and focus.

Green Dot Public Schools National

Green Dot's mission is to help transform public education so that all students graduate prepared for college. We are a school operating organization with 26 high performing public charter schools across three cities - Los Angeles, Memphis and Tacoma. We are exploring avenues to expand our impact so that we can work towards fulfilling our mission and vision.

Harmony Public Schools

Harmony Public Schools is a high performing, nonprofit charter management organization which operates 48 K-12 schools in Texas. Harmony Public Schools focuses on STEM and it is known as the largest network of STEM schools in the country to create college pathway for students from low income families.

IDEA Public Schools

IDEA Public Schools opens and operates high-performing charter schools that prepare low-income students to go to and through college. IDEA has a strong track record of serving students in urban, rural, and semi-rural communities in Texas, and we are interested in partnering with district leaders in Louisiana to determine if and how a charter strategy (either within a single district or across multiple districts) might help to improve student outcomes and school performance

Matchbook Learning

Matchbook learning is focused on turning around the bottom 5% of schools in the nation. We do this work through a competency based design personalized to students and adults and delivered in a blended format.





RePublic Schools

RePublic Computer Science works with schools and districts to design pathways for students to learn and master computer science. With a project-based curriculum that aligns to AP Computer Science Principles from middle to high school and a non-expert dependent teacher training model, RePublic successfully creates a program and space for students and teachers to thrive and master content that is redesigning every industry

WHOLE SCHOOL DESIGN

2Revolutions

Led by former turnaround operators from Mastery Charter Schools and Scholar Academies, 2 Revolutions is providing schools and districts with personalized turnaround implementation support services. We provide tailored coaching and training to school teams to implement our school turnaround blueprint developed from years of experience working in turnaround schools. We will work with schools over a three to five year timeframe to build capacity to effectively operate a previously low-performing school.

Academy for Urban School Leadership (AUSL)

AUSL (Academy for Urban School Leadership) is a nationally recognized Chicago nonprofit school management organization that creates schools of excellence by developing highly effective teachers and transforming educational outcomes for students in the lowest performing schools. The AUSL program is a school intervention model predicated on evidence based practices for teaching and learning, leadership development and support, data management systems, family engagement, and wraparound supports for our most vulnerable students. Through AUSL's Advisory Services, our approach involves partnering with districts. Instead of taking over the operations of a school or leading a turnaround implementation, AUSL will offer tools, training, and support, through a consultative relationship, to build the foundation for Louisiana's districts and schools to support all of its persistently struggling schools.

American Institute for Research

American Institutes for Research is a nonprofit, nonpartisan behavioral and social science research, evaluation, assessment and technical assistance organization. AIR's mission is to conduct and apply the best behavioral and social science research and evaluation towards improving people's lives, with a special emphasis on the disadvantaged. Our capacity building services are grounded in evidence, and our field-based experiences inform our assessment, research and technical assistance activities.

Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD)

ASCD offers K-12 schools and districts research-based professional learning resources (Books, articles, virtual PD libraries) and services. Services include face to face and virtual supports around a myriad of topics (from leadership to social-emotional support). We can offer workshops, key note presentations, coaching, consulting, virtual webinars, etc.

Blueprint Schools Network

Blueprint Schools Network is a national nonprofit organization that promotes educational equity and improves life outcomes for students by partnering with states, districts, and schools to plan, implement, and monitor school improvement initiatives. The foundation of our work is a framework of five core strategies that emerged through analyses of the attributes that drive student achievement and represent common elements of schools capable of closing the achievement gap. Together, these strategies form the foundation of our three distinct and differentiated pathways for





partnering with schools, districts and states: School Improvement Partnership, School Operator and Blueprint Math Fellows academic intervention program.

Diplomas Now

Diplomas Now, a collaboration between Johns Hopkins University's Talent Development Secondary, City Year, and Communities In Schools, is an innovative, multi-year approach to whole-school improvement for middle and high schools. Diplomas Now uses an early warning system to identify students who are off track in attendance, behavior, and course performance in English and math – highly predictive indicators that a student will drop out of high school. Teams of full-time AmeriCorps members and professional staff provide students with individualized academic and social-emotional support, teachers with professional development, school leaders with school organization support and case management for students all to ensure students get on track to high school graduation and college, career, and life success.

Empower Schools

Many efforts to improve educational outcomes either seek to dismantle traditional school systems to make room for new charter schools or attempt to patch existing schools with additional funds, but only minor changes. Empower Schools believes in a Third Way that empowers educators and leaders at the school-level through a 'cluster strategy' called an Empowerment Zone that enables more than one school in a district to operate under conditions of increased autonomy. Empower Schools engages in regulatory entrepreneurship to identify and leverage existing laws and policies to foster conditions for school improvement; design and transition support to provide educators with support partners, tools, and resources to effectively implement new flexibilities; and collaborative community decision-making to ensure local stakeholders have a voice in changes in their community's schools.

Generation Ready

Generation Ready partners with and provides support to K-12 educators to build capacity and raise student achievement so that all students are prepared for success in college and career. We offer highly customized engagements that target the professional learning needs of teachers and leaders. We offer a range of professional learning services in Literacy, Mathematics, and Leadership, and School Improvement.

Generation Schools Network

Generation Schools Network in partnership with Battelle for Kids comes alongside schools, districts and networks of schools to identify and address the most pressing challenges impacting students, teachers and their communities. Following a collaborative diagnostic review process, the organizations bring their expertise to stabilize, support implementation of critical practices and initiatives and help schools move toward innovation and exemplary student performance. Services range from diagnostic review, strategic planning and leadership coaching to schedule redesign, support for quality core instruction, social/emotional learning and college/career readiness using an embedded blended approach.

Institute for Student Achievement

The Institute for Student Achievement (ISA) partners with schools and districts to reinvent high schools so that students who are traditionally underserved and underperforming graduate prepared for success in college. ISA's federally-approved (What Works Clearinghouse), research-based, and evidence-driven model provides the organizational and professional development supports that schools, principals, and teachers need to succeed. ISA's primary solutions include: 1) starting new academies, small learning communities, or schools as part of a district portfolio strategy; 2) redesigning existing high schools to strengthen teaching, enhance social-emotional supports, and develop a college-going culture; and 3) provide





targeted services that focus on one area of school improvement to strengthen ongoing reforms (eg. writing across the curriculum, developing mathematical thinking, school leadership coaching, et al.)

Leading Educators

Leading Educators partners with districts to reimagine systems of professional learning for teachers. After partnering with a district to set up conditions for successful professional learning at schools, we work closely with schools' leadership teams and content leaders (including teacher leaders and a principal or assistant principal) to lead content-based cycles of professional learning that will drive student achievement.

Mass Insight Education

The mission of Mass Insight Education (MIE) is to provide leadership in closing the achievement and opportunity gaps for underserved students to drive college and career success by focusing on system transformation and student academic success. MIE believes that increasing academic achievement and opportunities for students in the lowest-performing schools in our country requires dramatic and fundamental change to the systems in which those schools, and the teachers and students in them, operate. We understand that, to bring about dramatic, systemic, and sustained change, we need to provide both new ideas and data-driven solutions, and create communities of practice and learning in which stakeholders can come together, identify and collaborate around common goals, change practices to ensure rigorous academics, build capacity for systems change and ultimately create living blueprints for changing similar systems.

New Schools for Baton Rouge

New Schools for Baton Rouge (NSBR) is a nonprofit organization that partners with communities to ensure that every child has the opportunity to attend a high quality school. Premised on the idea that students benefit and schools succeed when there is a thriving "education ecosystem", NSBR supports a portfolio of partners - including school operators, talent organizations, university programs, etc. -- that it brings together and coordinates under a shared vision of excellence. NSBR would work with the district to tailor transformation strategy to local need.

Propeller

At Propeller, we drive social, environmental, and economic impact by incubating and accelerating social ventures that have the potential to solve the city's most pressing issues. We believe that Educational Equity is a pressing issue, and we address these challenges by supporting entrepreneurs who have ideas to make changes. Public Impact

Public Impact works nationally to dramatically improve learning outcomes for all children in the United States via direct school and district support and its Opportunity Culture initiative, now active in 12 districts and over 100 schools. Relay Graduate School of Education

School Empowerment Network

SEN believes that even the most struggling districts are home to talented educators who, when properly recognized and developed, have great potential to lead transformative change in their schools. SEN employs a rigorous internal search process aimed at selecting for the competencies and mindsets that are prerequisites for success. Once the most promising individuals have been identified, SEN's development program provides direction and support to help them formulate and stay focused on their school leadership vision, and to maintain positive momentum in the face of the inevitable challenges they will encounter in their new roles. SEN also works with school districts to re-design school structures to maximize the impact that new leaders have on their communities. SEN advocates for small schools, Small Learning Communities within schools, and/or the phase-in of a renewed school culture one grade at a time whenever possible. Limiting the size of schools helps leaders dramatically raise the bar for quality and hold community members to renewed standards.

School Leadership Center

The School Leadership Center has a 20 year history of helping schools and school districts improve by focusing on the leadership of the individual school. Through SLC's two years of PD in our Fellows Program and the year long Discovery Walks Program SLC maintains a focus on improved student achievement.

Summit Learning

Summit Learning is a free program that provides support and resources to public schools to bring personalized learning-and the Summit Learning Platform--into their classrooms. The program is designed to help schools implement learning environments driven by (1) cognitive skills instruction through project based learning, (2) competency based content progression, and (3) mentorship and support around long and short term goal setting for students. Schools that participate in the program receive access to the Summit Learning Platform, a fully customizable 6-12 grade curriculum around core classes, various training and ongoing PD experiences, and access to a community of schools around the country engaging in the same work.





Talent Development Secondary

Talent Development Secondary is a nationally recognized whole-school reform organization with more than twenty years of experience in providing evidence-based tools and services that lead to increased cohort graduation rates. Curricular and instructional supports for teachers and students are designed to increase student performance on End of Course exams and tests such as the ACT. TDS' whole school model provides school leaders and staff customized, ongoing onsite support and technical assistance to develop small learning communities implementing data-based instruction and interventions at whole-school, class, small group, and individual levels; TDS also offers stand-alone components of its model on a contractual basis to address specific assessed needs, such as implementing a multi-tiered Early Warning Intervention System.
