With initial ESSER funding, our LEA did provide allocations to each school on a per pupil basis using enrollment counts. Each school determined expenditures based on school and student specific COVID needs. We further increased resource equity by providing funds specific to English Learners, students with disabilities and our homeless population for targeted learning support as well as counseling. Additionally, programs were open to all students each summer to address learning loss and social emotional issues brought about by the pandemic. For extra layers of learning support, instructional coaches & an additional curriculum supervisor were hired to work with all LEA teachers to further refine Tier 1 classroom instruction and the response to intervention process for all students.
