A review of the district's 2020-2021 LEAP data for 3rd grade ELA revealed 27% achieved mastery and 0% in math as compared to 0% ELA and math in 2021-2022. The district will continue its plan to implement instruction to grow teachers and students by using NIET Best Practices. In addition, all students will receive Tier 1 instruction with differentiation to meet the needs of each student. After school remediation and tutoring will continue to assist in closing skills that are lacking in achievement gaps due to loss learning. As a result of these supports, students during the 2023 - 2024 school year, will show growth or achieve scores of mastery or above on the state's assessments. With the continuation of collaborations or cluster meetings and Kagan structures of supports as well as high-dosage tutoring using Zearn for mathematics and ELA Guidebopoks to promote literacy to promote learning throughout the day. The district anticipates an increase in student performances during the 2023-2024 school year state wide assessments.

The LEA will implement at least three Zearn math lessons per week to assist with closing the achievement gaps because of loss learning. In addition, the ELA Guidebooks' lessons will be taught with fidelity and also provide to the students the extra support lessons that focus on targeted skills due to loss learning. Instructional coaches, Master and Mentor teachers, and building administrators will work together analyzing classroom and school data during weekly ILT Meetings. Individual plans of instruction will be creted for each student so that accurate progress monitoring is effective and taking place weekly.

LSSD's I.T. Team maintains firewalls and any related upgrades for Internet security. Students and families must comply with the district's Internet Usage policy. Data Sharing agreements are in place with any vendor who receives Student PII. LSSD contracts with EdGeat annually for its Student Information System, J-Campus. J-Campus has a built in features to track student progress. EdGear maintains all of J-Campus' security and related updates. EdGear implements upgrades and new features annually to update in keeping with LDOE data system reporting changes. LDOE and OTS maintains security for the state reporting system. LSSD also opts into LDOE data sharing agreements for various systems.
