



# **World Language Certificate Application – (WLC)**

International Associate Teachers (IATs) are certified to teach in Louisiana using the World Language Certificate (WLC). Districts should help first year IATs complete this application during their on-boarding process.

## All WLC applications should be uploaded into the Teach LA Live! portal by September 11.

### First steps:

- District identified employee should use the <u>Teach LA Live! User Guide for School System Personnel (HR)</u> to set up an account.
- Download the World Language Certificate application packet.

### With the applicant:

- Check appropriate boxes on page 1.
- COMPLETE all information on page 2.
  - Names should match placement chart.
  - O Verify birthday is MM/DD/YYYY.
  - List up to three degrees, post high school. Degree(s) should be written in the original language of the diploma. **DO NOT translate**.
- COMPLETE professional conduct form (page 3); Applicant will SIGN.
- COMPLETE experience verification form (page 4); Applicant and District will SIGN.
- SCAN completed packet to PDF.
  - Save as LAST NAME(S), First Name

### Portal Directions:

- Access the Teach LA Live Portal.
- There is no charge for the WLC. You will not need to access the "Payment Portal."
- Select "Submit Certification Application."




From the dropdown menu, select "World Language Certificate."






# Submit only one applicant's request per submission. All files related to this person's application should be combined for quicker uploading/processing. \*Application Type World Language Certificate

- Enter applicant's name in the following manner: Last Name(s), First Name
  - O Many international teachers have 2 last names. They should be entered together with no hyphen. Names should match placement chart.



- Upload saved PDF of WLC application.
- Click submit.
