

As school systems prepare to receive Achieve Funds, they should consider using some of them to address learning and/or language loss for English Learners (ELs).

<u>EL Programming</u> should include direct and indirect English Language Development (ELD) for ELs adversely impacted by school disruptions and/or who are demonstrating low levels of overall proficiency on ELPT or ELPS. Funding can be used for language and learning loss evaluation or assessment, for parent outreach and engagement activities, to purchase supplemental curriculum materials to improve and/or expand instructional programs for ELS, and/or supplemental ELD and professional development (PD) for staff. Some suggestions are as follows:

Language and/or learning loss evaluation and assessment:

Literacy/Access to Books

Use funds to purchase texts and/or text devices that are accessible and reflective of linguistically diverse students.

Parent Support

Use funds to make materials more accessible to parents to support their child's learning (even if it is in their home language) at home.

Additional Options

Summer ELD program

Provide an ELD program for students who have demonstrated a language loss or lower English proficiency for the summer months. Use the funds to pay staff and purchase materials/programs.

Tutors for ELD or core content support

Tutors are available to assist ELs (virtually or in-person) with either direct ELD or with supporting content learning. Use funds to pay tutors an hourly wage.

Multicultural Book Clubs

Purchase texts (or devices) for students to use as part of a multicultural book club facilitated by staff trained in reading and/or literacy.

U.S. Civics/history education

Provide overview classes or tutorials for either parents or students on U.S. civics, history, Louisiana history. This is especially helpful for students who have entered the U.S. education system at a later age (12 or older) and have not received this earlier instruction. Use funds to purchase materials and to pay an instructor

Newcomers' Club/classes

Facilitate newcomer club or classes that offer an overview of school in the U.S., acculturation, and social language opportunities. Include literacy and foundational skills instruction if needed. Use funds to purchase materials and to pay an instructor/facilitator.

Language Labs

Offer (in person or virtual) access to language programs/tutoring services for either lower English proficient ELs or parents. Use funds to purchase the program, devices, and to pay a facilitator.
