

Student Planning Partners

School systems may request funds from this approved list of **student planning partners** to support IGP updates for high school students or college and career transitions for graduated seniors. This guide summarizes the services each student planning partner can provide. Providers range in cost from free **\$**, low overall cost or per student rate and/or limited services **\$\$**, or higher investment in cost per school structure and/or range of services **\$\$**.

<u>Individual graduation planning</u> starts in the eighth grade and continues throughout every student's high school career. Individual graduation plans should be updated annually and signed by the student, a parent or guardian, and the school counselor.

<u>Postsecondary Planning</u> includes supporting students as they apply for college and explore funding opportunities (scholarships and grants).

<u>Career Supports for Students Transitioning to the Workforce</u> lists partners who can further support students in exploring options once they graduate and move into the workforce.

Description: The TDS model includes co-constructing a multi-tiered system to ensure all students are on-track for graduation and experience post-secondary readiness milestones. The MTSS support includes designing or refining tiers of support. Quarterly graduation conferences with each student to encourage ownership, reflection and planning for their postsecondary experience is a process TDS helps to put in place. Student level data is analyzed and used to inform tiered supports and future conference cycles. TDS uses the LDOE High School Planning Guidebook and other existing tools to co-create professional learning sessions and additional resources.
