

- F. France declared war with England to regain the territory.


Item 2: Multiple Choice

0	Student's response does not explain how gaining control of the Louisiana Territory would make the United States safer and does not explain how the purchase protected the nation's trade.

Scoring Notes:

Louisiana Territory made the United States safer:

- The expanded borders of the United States opened the Louisiana Territory for westward expansion, and there was no need to fight for this area with other nations.
- Accept other reasonable answers.

Louisiana Territory protected the nation's trade:

- The Port of New Orleans was a key port for trade and economic expansion. The United States now controlled all trade coming in and out of the port.
- With the Louisiana Purchase, Jefferson kept the port out of the hands of a foreign power that could cut off access at any time.
- Accept other reasonable answers.
