LEAP 2025 High School	<ul> <li>Only the LEAP 2025 US History assessment will be available. The US History EOC (4-level) assessment will no longer be administered.</li> <li>Graduating students and re-testers, not enrolled in the course, will take the Biology EOC (4-level) assessment in order to receive inwindow results.</li> <li>LEAP 2025 Biology assessment results will be released in the Summer of 2019 on a similar timeline as the release of the 2018 LEAP 2025 US History results.</li> <li>A LEAP 2025 Biology practice test is available.</li> </ul>	2018-19 High School Assessment FAQ Assessment Guides

National and International Assessments (selected districts only)	<ul> <li>The International Early Learning Study (IELS) is an international play-based assessment of five-year-olds' emerging numeracy, literacy, self-regulation, and social emotional skills.</li> <li>The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what America's students know and can do in various subject areas in 4th, 8th, and 12th grades.</li> <li>The Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) is an international online assessment conducted every three years of 15-year-old students that measures how well students apply their knowledge and skills in reading, mathematics, and science.</li> <li>The Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS) enables countries around the world to measure how effective they are in teaching mathematics and science for the 4th and 8th graders.</li> </ul>	IELS website  NAEP website  PISA website  TIMSS website
