

1. Introduction

Students in grades 3 through high school may take practice tests in English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies to help prepare them for the LEAP 2025 statewide tests administered later in the school year. The practice tests allow students to do the following:

- become familiar with the testing format
- practice using the online tools for computer-based tests
- respond to some of the types of questions they may find on the LEAP 2025 tests

Paper-based practice tests (PBT) for grade 3 are available in the [Practice Test Library](#) of the Department’s website. Paper versions of all of the practice tests are available in the [DRC INSIGHT Portal](#) by selecting **General Information—Documents—Teacher Access—Show Documents**. The school or district test coordinator can help users if they do not have access to this part of the portal. Computer-based practice tests (CBT) for grades 3 through high school are administered through the Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) INSIGHT testing platform.

It is recommended that teachers download the paper versions and use the practice test guidance found in the [Practice Test Library](#) to incorporate the content into their classroom instruction and assessments throughout the school year.

2. Practice Test Guidance

Teachers should use the [English language arts](#), [mathematics](#), [science](#) and [social studies](#) Practice Test Guidance documents posted in the [Practice Test Library](#) to better understand how the practice tests can be used to support instructional goals, rather than as isolated test prep. 4. Scoring

General Scoring Information

The online practice tests are scored using a combination of automated and teacher scoring. Selected-response items (e.g., multiple choice, multiple select, and evidence-based), technology-enhanced items, and fill-in-the-blank responses are automatically scored by the online system; however, responses to constructed- and extended- response items are scored by teachers. The [DRC INSIGHT Portal User Guide](#) explains how teachers access and use the Educator Scoring application in [DRC INSIGHT](#) to score student responses. Prior to using the Educator Scoring application, teachers should retrieve the scoring rubrics from the answer key documents, found in the [Practice Test Library](#) or [DRC INSIGHT](#) under **Documents** in the General Information tab. All items on the paper versions of the practice tests are scored by teachers using the answer keys.

Answer Keys

The grade-level and content area answer keys are available in [DRC INSIGHT](#) and in the [Practice Test Library](#). The answer keys include answers to all item types, alignment information, and rubrics for scoring the constructed- and extended- response items. Direct links to the practice test answer keys are in the table below.

5. Reporting

Reports will generate in the DRC INSIGHT portal within 24 hours of the completion of at least one test session. DTCs or STCs wishing to issue reports without completing all sessions must log-in to eDIRECT and select the “End Incomplete Test Session” button inside of the test session tab before printing. This allows teachers and schools to use reports to support the instructional use of practice tests detailed in the Practice Test Guidance documents posted in [the Practice Test Library](#). Only one test session within a practice test needs to be completed for reports to generate. Additionally, educator scoring does not need to be completed for reports to generate. Reports will refresh nightly after the initial posting to reflect any changes in test session completion and/or educator scoring.

The Report Delivery Menu of the DRC INSIGHT Portal User Guide explains how to access the online practice test reports in [DRC INSIGHT](#) and gives an explanation of the reports provided. There are no student or test session summary reports for practice tests. The following reports are available for practice test assessments:
