1. State Guidelines for Nominating Students:

- The principal of any public or private school may recommend one male and one female student.
- A representative of the school must contact Marian Johnson (marian.johnson@la.gov) for the essay topics since this is a test secure item with specific protocols.

2. United States Senate Youth Program Requirements

- Juniors or seniors who have been elected or appointed to a student government, civic, or educational organization (campus student government officer or representative), class officer, appointment to a local, district, or state, panel, commission, or board, National Honor Society officer may apply.
- They must be actively serving in qualified leadership positions, enrolled in high school and living in the state they will represent for the entire 2019 2020 academic year.
- The student must be enrolled in a public or private secondary school in the state which their parent or guardian resides for the entire 2019-2020 academic year.
- The student(s) must be a permanent resident or citizen of the United States or in possession of their I-511 / 'green card" at the time of the application.
- Student must be able to attend the Annual Washington Week, March 7-14, 2020.

3. Submission Information

The names of the students nominated and their application portfolios must be received either electronically or by mail no later October 1, 2019 to marian.johnson@la.gov or the physical address below:

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United States Senate Youth State Timeline

- August 1 Scholarship applications become available on-line on the Louisiana Believes website (www.louisianabelieves.com). Letters and forms are sent to non-public high schools informing them of the competition and deadlines. An information blurb is placed in the Network Newsletter Core Connection for all public and charter high schools, notifying them of the competition and relevant deadlines.
- Aug.-Sept. Schools select their nominee(s), assist with the compilation of the portfolio, and proctor the essay that must be included in the portfolio.
- October 1 Deadline for the electronic or paper submission of the portfolio to the LDOE.
- October 21 The top four portfolio submissions will be notified by e-mail, inviting them to complete the final interview and test.
- October 30 The top four students interview, test, and reception at the Claiborne Building in Baton Rouge.
- December 1 Names must be submitted to the Hearst Foundation (two winners and two alternates). Candidates are notified in mid-December after the Hearst Foundation releases the names of all of the delegates.

- School and Extracurricular activities (1-2 pages)
- Citizenship and community involvement (1-2 pages)
- Description of hobbies and future plans (1-2 pages)
- The completed essay written according to the guidelines provided to the school official who will proctor the timed essay. Essay topics will only be released to a school official.
- Statement from the principal or faculty affirming that the student received no assistance in writing the essay and he/she completed the essay within the time limit.
