



The Louisiana Department of Education has been designated by federal law to process new child care criminal background checks (CCCBCs). These new background checks are required by federal law in an effort to reduce the risk of children being harmed.

Starting March 1, 2018, the Department will determine a person's eligibility for child care purposes based upon the results of the person's new criminal background check every five years.

What will be included in the new child care criminal background check:

- 1. A fingerprint-based search of the Louisiana criminal history record information (CHRI);
- 2. A fingerprint-based search of the Federal criminal history record information;
- 3. A request to DCFS to search the State Central Registry of Child Abuse and Neglect;
- 4. A search of the Louisiana Sex Offender and Child Predator Registry;
- 5. A search of the National Sex Offender Registry; and
- 6. A request for a search of the name-based state criminal history information record, state sex offender registry, and state registry of child abuse and neglect in each state where such person resided in the past five years.

Transition Periods	Licensed Centers			
Starting March 1, 2018	• <u>Anyone who is hired NEW on or after March 1, 2018, will have to get the NEW criminal background check prior to starting work</u> . This includes owners, volunteers, staff, members, employees, independent contractors, and other entities (R&R staff, CLASS observers, etc.)			
April 1, 2018 – May 31, 2018	• Existing owners, operators, directors, director designees and staff-in-charge			
May 1, 2018 – June 30, 2018	• Existing volunteers and staff members employed for five or more years. This includes all currently-employed volunteers and staff members who started at the center prior to March 1, 2013.			
June 1, 2018 – July 31, 2018	 Existing volunteers, staff members employed between two and five years. This includes all currently-employed volunteers and staff members who started at the center between March 1, 2013 and March 1, 2016. Existing visitors, independent contractors, and other entities (R&R staff, CLASS observers, etc.). This includes all individuals who had a satisfactory Right to Review or CBC prior to March 1, 2018. 			
July 1, 2018 – August 31, 2018	• All existing volunteers and staff members employed for two years or less. This includes all currently-employed volunteers and staff members who started at the center between March 2, 2016 and February 28, 2018.			

How will Louisiana transition to the new criminal background checks:

For all Licensed Centers (includes Type I, II and III):

For Family Home and In-Home Providers that serve children with Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) funding:

- **NEW** home-based providers must have a new CCCBC beginning March 1, 2018.
- Existing home-based providers who have an existing satisfactory CBC on March 1, 2018 must obtain a CCCBC at the time of renewal of certification or before August 1, 2018. Other required persons associated with home-based providers must have a new CCCBC before October 1, 2018.
