

Q: When will students take AP exams?

A: The College Board will be offering two dates for AP exams with one date in May and another later in the summer. They will have finalized information and dates by April 3.

Q: What devices or software will be required for students to take the exam online?

A: Students will be able to take exams on any device they have access to, in addition to submitting a photo of handwritten work.

Q: What if students do not have access to technology in order to take exams?

Q: What if students do not want to take the exam?

A: The College Board encourages students to take the exam, but recognizes some students may opt to cancel their registration. Students who are already registered for the exam, but wish to not take it can choose to cancel at no charge.
