The Individual Student Graduation Planning Intervention Strategy will support, promote, and execute the IGP process at CIR high schools by funding intermediary support partners to assist schools in creating a comprehensive program of individual student planning for college and career readiness in grades 9-12.

Background

The development and annual review of an individual graduation plan (IGP) prepares students for success in high school and beyond. An IGP is developed with the input of the student, family, and school counselor.

- Starts by the end of the eighth grade
- Supports the exploration of educational and career opportunities
- Helps families make appropriate secondary and postsecondary education decisions
- Guides the selection of coursework
- Documents diploma pathway

A student's IGP is reviewed, updated, and signed annually through graduation.

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Intervention Strategy

All CIR high schools have the opportunity to request up to \$20,000 to work with an intermediary planning support partner to assist them with planning for all students in grades 9 through 12.

In order to have CIR/UIR-A plans approved and to be eligible for any funding, CIR high schools should select at least <u>one planning partner</u> to support the IGP process, financial aid planning, and/or college and career transitional support.

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Student Planning Partners

The <u>Student Planning Partners</u> guide is a comprehensive list of partners identified to provide support with this strategy.

The guide is divided into three sections:

- Individual Graduation Planning
- Postsecondary Planning
- Career Supports for Students Transitioning to the Workforce

IGP Planning Partners

Support partners collaborate with schools and school systems to identify the services that best meet their needs. Possible activities for individual graduation planning partners include:

- providing professional development to strengthen knowledge of the IGP process.
- working directly with students to complete and maintain IGPs,
 - exploring career opportunities.
 - selecting and listing required courses.
 - aligning coursework to personal and academic interests.
 - selecting a graduation pathway.
 - applying for scholarships and financial aid.
- consulting with the school leadership team to create a comprehensive program.

Postsecondary Planning Partners

Although school counselors are the primary advisors for high school students, there are organizations that can further support schools, students, and families with planning for graduation, exploring postsecondary options and researching financial aid possibilities.

- Assist your students with all steps of postsecondary planning
- College search assistance
- Admissions/Financial Aid experience is essential
- Virtual Meeting and Appointments are important
- Mentoring services for this year and beyond
- Scholarships opportunities assistance

Career Transition Partners

Quality transition planning starts with the collection of data from informal or formal assessments of students strengths, needs, preferences and Interests over time from multiple stakeholders regarding (a) academic skills, (b) career interests and aptitudes, (c) self-determination skills and opportunities, and (d) independent living skills.

<u>Taxonomy for Transition Programming 2.0</u> (Kohler, Gothberg, Fowler, and Coyle, 2016) outlines five primary practice areas of transition-focused education: Student-Focused Planning, Student Development, Interagency Collaboration, Family Engagement, and Program Structure.

Career Transition Partners included in the <u>Student Planning Partner</u> guide can support school systems and students by providing post-secondary planning, career planning, work readiness, work-based learning, job coaching, job placement, and more.
