

Digital Learning Model - School Systems





TRT Data Submission Process

What is collected via the Technology Readiness Tool upload forms:

- Device Data
- Internet, Network, Staffing and Home Internet Data

Who is required to submit: All Public School Systems (includes all charters) and all private schools who participate in the scholarship program. Other private schools should submit their Home Internet Connectivity data at a minimum.

Submission Process:

- School systems who have submitted data in the past will receive by email a copy of their previous submissions to update. School systems who have never submitted, will be provided a blank form to submit their data.
- Updated blank forms can be downloaded from the [Digital Schools System Support Toolbox](#).
- A recording of the Dec. 3 Education Technology Office Hours Call if available on LDOE's YouTube page, or a link can be sent to you by emailing EdTech@la.gov.

Reallocated Coronavirus Recovery Funds

The Louisiana legislature allocated \$8 million to the LDOE for distance learning devices. The vote came during a December meeting of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget. The allocation is funded with \$8 million from the Coronavirus Recovery Fund (CRF).

LDOE purchased 23,118 Chromebooks that are being distributed to school systems across the state for schools serving grades K-8. This technology will provide students with the latest tools to make learning relevant.

The Department created device distribution allotment using the same methodology as the ESSER fund allocation. Devices should be distributed by the end of February.

These devices will be used to support Strong Start Tutoring, which begins February 1.

Chromebook Allotment

LEAs receiving an chromebook allotment from the Coronavirus Recovery Fund will receive an email today with instructions and details on the distribution of devices. LEAs must also complete the following steps:

- Complete all data submission required as part of the Strong Start School Reopening Dashboard
 - Submit their January 2021 Technology Readiness Tool Device and Connectivity data
 - Ensure they have updated their LEA's and school's Learning Mode data in SPS
- Complete the assurance document and email to EdTech@la.gov
- Complete the attached Google Management License Order and email to EdTech@la.gov
- Once the assurance document and Google Order has been received, the Department's Ed Tech staff will schedule a pick up date and time. The LEA is responsible for picking up all devices allotted to the LEA from the Office of Technology Services' Warehouse in Baton Rouge.

If an LEA does not wish to receive their allotment, the LEA may decline the allotment by checking the appropriate box on the assurance form and return it to EdTech@la.gov.

Education Broadband Benefit Program

The Emergency Broadband Benefit (“EBB”) program provides \$3.2 billion to subsidize the purchase of remote devices and home internet services during the pandemic. EBB is to be implemented by the FCC, but not as a part of the E-rate program.

Appropriations: The funds shall be provided from the U.S. Treasury and not from the Universal Service Fund.

Household eligibility: At least one member of the household must meet one of these criteria:

- Qualify for the Lifeline program;
- Receive free and reduced price lunch or the breakfast program as verified by the school;
- Have experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020;
- Receive a federal Pell Grant in the current award year; or
- Meet the eligibility criteria for a participating provider’s existing low-income or COVID–19 broadband internet connectivity program.


Education Broadband Benefit Program (cont')

- **Eligible household broadband discount:** A household shall be eligible for a \$50/month discount or \$75/month on tribal land on its internet service cost. This discount shall be applied to the actual amount charged by the provider, not including taxes/fees.
- **Eligible household connected device discount:** A service provider who supplies a household with a connected device may be reimbursed up to \$100. A provider may receive reimbursement for only one connected device per household. A connected device is a laptop or desktop computer.
- **Eligible provider certification:** Participating service provider must certify adherence to several conditions including a household will not be subject to any early termination fee on a contract.
- **Timeframe of emergency period:** Starts the date of the enactment and expires 6 months after the date on which the Secretary of Health and Human Services determines the COVID-19 emergency has ended.
- **Post-program household connectivity:** At the conclusion of the EBB program, any participating households shall be subject to a participating provider's generally applicable terms and conditions of internet service connectivity.

State Education Technology Plan

The Department is working on a new state-level technology plan and has begun forming focus group sessions to seek input on various topics from various stakeholder groups. The goal is to roll out this new plan in late Spring so that school systems can update their plans going into the 2021-22 school year. As this process continues, we will provide updates and more information.





Operations

Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (CAA)

On December 21, 2020, Congress released the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (CCA). This legislation includes a COVID-19 relief package specifying appropriations provisions of \$81.9* billion to Governors, State, and Local Educational Agencies (LEAs), and higher education institutions. Additionally, the legislation includes several other education-related provisions for childcare providers and internet connectivity.

- Education Stabilization Funds Summary
- Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEERF 2) - \$4.1 billion
- Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSERF 2 Fund)- \$54.3 billion
- Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) \$22.7 billion

In addition, the bill provides \$10 billion in childcare funding for assistance to providers and families and \$3.2 billion for a new Federal Communications Commission (FCC) broadband fund providing monthly subsidies for internet service and subsidized Wi-Fi-connected devices during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (CAA)

There is a new focus on addressing “learning loss” for students disproportionately affected by coronavirus and school closures, particularly high-need students. The Department is engaging with various stakeholders to gather input on how to best utilize the federal stimulus funds based on the needs of students, families, and educators.

ESSER II: Funding Guidance

Funds can be used for previously allowed CARES Act expenses and for new uses, including:

- Addressing learning loss such as by administering assessments to assess progress, implementing evidence-based activities
- Purchasing the hardware and software needed to conduct remote and hybrid learning
- Providing services to support student mental health
- Tracking attendance and improving student engagement
- Supporting afterschool and summer learning programs
- School facility repairs and improvements to reduce risk of virus
- Efforts to improve indoor air quality
- Purchasing PPE and the supplies needed to clean and disinfect schools. The CDC has provided an [analysis of the costs](#) of such resources

Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund

The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) provides \$4.1 billion for the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund. Of this amount, \$2.75 billion is reserved for an Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools (EANS) program.





SETDA E-Rate Training Sessions

SETDA has launched the new [E-Rate Training Series: Ask the State Experts](#). These trainings are designed to support and train school, district, consortium and library leaders on the E-Rate application process. A single Fall or Winter session will cost \$99 or \$150 for both sessions. Participants will have access to the session archives after the events.

The format of the trainings will be 90-minute online, interactive sessions running monthly through April, 2021. These trainings will be conducted by state leaders from [SETDA's E-Rate Collaborative](#), a subset of the [SETDA](#) membership, who are subject matter experts on the topic of E-Rate. E-Rate Updates

- FY 2021 Application Window opened on Friday, January 15, 2021 and will close on Thursday, March 25, 2021 at 11:59 pm EDT.
- Effective January 20th, Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel was designated Acting Chair of the FCC by President Biden. Rosenworcel has long been a proponent of using E-rate funding for off-campus internet use to address the “Homework Gap,” and remote learning.
- The new [Executive Order on Supporting the Reopening and Continuing Operation of Schools and Early Childhood Education Providers](#) signed by President Biden on January 21st encouraged the FCC , consistent with applicable law, to increase connectivity options for students lacking reliable home broadband, so that they can continue to learn if their schools are operating remotely.

E-Rate Updates

- Form 486 Deadlines:
 - **January 29** - Wave 23
 - **February 5** - Wave 24
 - **February 12** - Wave 25
 - **February 19** - Wave 26
 - **February 26** - Wave 27
- **February 25** - Last day to file a Form 470 for FY 2021 to allow the required 28-day posting requirement.
- **March 25** - The FY 2021 Form 471 application window will close at 11:59 p.m. EDT.

Preparing for the FY 2021 Filing Window

Applicants begin the process of applying for E-Rate by completing and certifying an FCC Form 470 in EPC. This opens the competitive bidding process for selecting services.

Applicants do not have to file an FCC Form 470 for FY2021 if:

- purchasing services from a state master contract where your state filed an FCC Form 470, conducted a competitive bidding process and resulted in a contract covers those services for all of FY2021;
- the applicant posted an FCC Form 470 for a previous funding year and conducted a competitive bidding process which resulted in a multi-year contract that covers your services for all of FY2021;
- the applicant is purchasing a commercially available, high-speed business-class internet service that meets ALL of the requirements listed in the [Exemption from Filing an FCC Form 470](#) guidance document on the USAC website.

Remember, Applicants must wait at least 28 days after certifying a FCC Form 470 before selecting a service provider, signing a contract, and completing and certifying the FCC Form 471.

Applicants who have not accessed EPC in the last six months

Last July, USAC added an additional step to the login process. To access EPC, applicants must first log in to One Portal, USAC's multifactor authentication (MFA) system. MFA is a method of authenticating a computer user during the login process by requiring the user to enter two or more separate pieces of information, such as a password known to the user and a code we generate and send to the user by email or text.

For existing users, USAC has automatically created accounts in One Portal. To set up your credentials, click the blue Sign In button at the top of any USAC page and follow the instructions. To see a demonstration of the login process, you can watch the [Forgot Password video](#). *(The process of logging in for the first time and the process of resetting your existing password are essentially the same.)*

Newly created users in EPC will automatically be set up with a One Portal account using their email address as their username. As above, click the blue Sign In button to get started. If you need assistance, call CSB at (888) 203-8100.
