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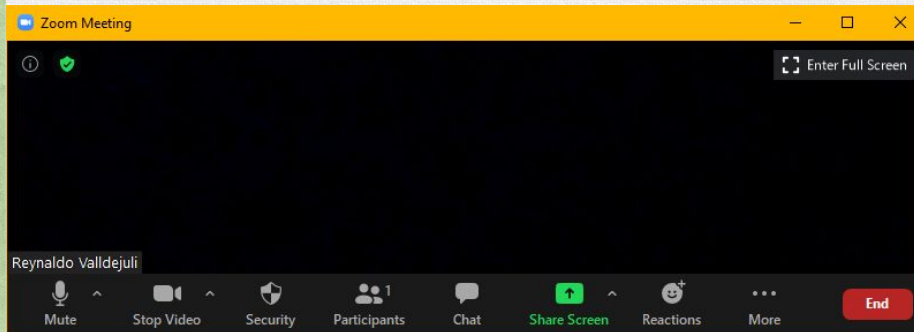

# Super App Submission & Approval Timeline

March 23	School systems receive Approval, Funding, and Implementation Summary documents.
April 18	BESE approves allocations.
April	Competitive funds are uploaded to Super App. School systems amend Super App to account for all formula and competitive allocations.
June 30	School systems amend and submit Super Apps for all formula and competitive allocations to ensure substantial approval by July 1.



# Super App Reviews

The Department review Super App in two ways:

- **Approval of Comprehensive Intervention Required (CIR)/Urgent Intervention Required (UIR) Strategy**

LDOE reviewed answers to designated questions within Super App to approve a LEA's CIR and UIR strategy and grant competitive funds.

- **Approval of Super App**

LDOE reviews LEA budgets, both formula and competitive funding, to ensure that each expenditures are allowable under the specific federal grant.

# CLSD CIR/UIR-A

## Discretionary grants:

- These one-year funds support Birth – 12<sup>th</sup> grade Literacy initiatives.
- For CLSD CIR/UIR-A B-5 (early childhood) funds, school systems should choose schools/sites with the greatest approximate percentage of disadvantaged children. This may include school sites, publicly funded child care sites, or Head Start sites.
- Eligible uses for CLSD CIR/UIR-A B-5 (early childhood) include: Science of Reading professional development and salary and benefits for literacy coaches.
- Eligible uses for CLSD CIR/UIR-A K-12 include: ELA high-quality curriculum (9-12 only), salary/benefits and trainings for Literacy Coaches, ELA and Speech Dual Enrollment classes, K-2 Literacy Content Leaders, and ELA Content Leaders at CIR/UIR-A sites.



# CLSD CIR/UIR-A

## Discretionary Grants:

- When creating budget line items for these funds, please include the name of the site(s) or school(s) where funds are being used in each description.
- School systems may not use CLSD CIR/UIR-A funds to provide duplicative payment for materials or activities within each school or child care site that were previously funded through SRCL funds.
- School systems receiving CLSD CIR/UIR-A funds are required to participate in a national evaluation, which will include, at a minimum, teachers and leaders completing a survey at least once during the school year.



# CLSD UIN

## Discretionary Grants:

- These one-year funds support Birth - 12th literacy signature innovations at UIN sites.
- Eligible funds for CSLD UIN include: salaries/benefits and trainings for Literacy Innovation Coordinators, trainings, stipends and materials to conduct literacy innovations.
- When creating budget line items for these funds, please include the name of the site(s) or school(s) where funds are being used in each description.
- School systems receiving CLSD UIN funds are required to participate in a national evaluation, which will include, at a minimum, teachers and leaders completing a survey at least once during the school year.



# ESSER II Incentive

## Discretionary Grants:

- These funds support arts curriculum, K-12 ELA / math (including Math Refresh) / science curriculum, and para to teaching stipends. These funds must be spent by September 30, 2023.
- School systems may purchase arts curriculum aligned to best practices in teaching and learning in visual art, dance, theatre, and music at any site regardless of label.
- School systems may purchase eligible Math Refresh materials to accelerate learning for students at any site regardless of label. Please see the [Louisiana Math Refresh Funding Guidance](#) for additional details, or contact [STEM@la.gov](mailto:STEM@la.gov) with questions.



## ESSER II Incentive (continued)

- School systems may provide a completion stipend to any school employee who successfully completed one year of a Para- to-Teacher training program during the 2022-2023 school year.
- School systems should confirm successful completion of one year of an approved program by their employees through the training program provider.
- School systems should communicate with recipients that this is a one-time completion stipend.

# ESSER III Incentive

## Discretionary Grants:

- School systems may purchase eligible Math Refresh materials to accelerate learning for students at any site regardless of label. Please see the [Louisiana Math Refresh Funding Guidance](#) for additional details, or contact [STEM@la.gov](mailto:STEM@la.gov) with questions.



# ESSER III Incentive (continued)

## Discretionary Grants:

- These funds may support the [New Teacher Experience](#) including:
  - stipends for Mentors supporting new teachers
  - travel costs for attending in person trainings
  - completion stipends for participating new teachers
- Registration for the New Teacher Experience Kick off will open in May. This event will be held in Baton Rouge on **July 26**.
- Registration for Affinity Groups and Professional Learning Modules will open in Summer 2023.

# K-2 ELA Curriculum (ESSER II & III)

## Discretionary Grants:

- Allocations provided for new K-2 high-quality instructional [materials](#) adoption.
- Selected materials must have passed Act 517 reviews.
- Esser II funds must be spent by September 30, 2023.

# IDEA 611 Set-Aside

## Discretionary Grants:

- To ensure that all teachers who teach students with disabilities receive PD on high-quality curriculum materials, these funds may support **up to 10% of the total cost** to provide ELA, math, or science orientation to curriculum professional development from vendors in the LDOE PD Vendor Guide.
- These funds may support **up to 100% of the total cost** to provide Specialized Support professional development from vendors in the Partnerships for Success Guide. These organizations can deliver high-quality professional development in the areas of specialized supports (communication, assistive technology, executive functioning, etc.).



# IDEA 619B Set-Aside

## Discretionary Grants:

- Allocations were provided to early childhood lead agencies to support students with disabilities ages 3-5.
- These funds may support **up to 100% of the total cost** to provide Specialized Support professional development from vendors in the Partnerships for Success Guide. These organizations can deliver high-quality professional development in the areas of specialized supports (communication, assistive technology, executive functioning, etc.).



# Redesign 1003

## **Discretionary Grants:**

Allowable school improvement expenditures at CIR & UIR-A sites for 2023-2024:

- Individual Graduation Planning Support Partners (high schools only)
- PK-12 ELA, math, and science curriculum
- PK-12 ELA, math, and science professional development
- Specialized Supports professional development
- School Improvement Best Practices
- 2023 Teacher Leader Summit registration and travel costs for CIR school participants attending SIBP sessions.



# Redesign 1003 (continued)

## Discretionary Grants:

- 2023-24 School Support Institute travel costs (Note: Registration costs for SSI participants from CIR/UIR-A schools, as well as for school system leaders, will be covered by LDOE outside of competitive funding awarded to school systems.)
- English Learner professional development
- Mentor Teacher training (CIR only)
- K-2 Literacy, ELA, Math, & Science Content Leaders
- CIR Content Leader stipends
- STEM pathway pilot



# Title IV

## Discretionary Grants:

- These funds may support approved strategies to address underlying cause(s) of the UIR-Discipline label at the school system's UIR-Discipline site(s).



## 8(g)

### Discretionary Grants:

- These funds support Strong School Systems Strategic Planning and Strong School Systems progress monitoring and implementation support. School systems participating in Phase I, Strategic Planning, will be allowed to send one participant to Louisiana Superintendent's Academy.
- Funding will be **available** in July 2023 and **expires** in June 2024.
- These funds support **100% of the total cost** to provide professional development from vendors in the Strong School Systems vendor guide. These organizations can deliver high-quality facilitation and professional development in the areas of strategic planning, progress monitoring, and implementation.

# Non-public Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- Please double check to be sure the Intent to Participate and Affirmation of Meaningful Consultation and Agreement forms that are uploaded have the correct dates, school year and signatures.
- Use the General Comment Box to state/list non-public schools that are for - profit, getting services via cross - district MOUs, declining services or did not respond after 2 to 3 outreach attempts, etc.
- Upload all forms of documentation for certified mail receipts/green cards, emails, etc. to document your outreach to offer equitable services to non-responsive non-public schools under the Intent to Participate file.
- Upload the Intent to Participate and/or Affirmation of Consultation and Agreement for all non-public schools receiving equitable services through an MOU in each designated file after the non-public schools that are in the LEA's school district.
- Be sure there are forms and/or documentation for each non-public school listed in the General Comment Box.
- LEAs do not have to upload Timely and Meaningful Consultations agendas, sign - in sheets or handouts. (Keep these items on file in your Federal Programs Dept.)



## Non-public Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- Friendly reminder... the number of approved non-public schools each LEA is inviting to participate is the number of non-public schools listed on the Nonpublic Academic Classification list for each Parish.
- Do not add the number for the non-public schools the LEA is serving via a MOU.
- List non-public schools the LEA is serving through a MOU in the General Comment Box.
- The number of non-public schools participating is only the number of schools listed under your LEA/parish that signed an Intent to Participate form for equitable services.
- In section B. Private School Allocation on the Private School Consultation page, add non-public schools being serviced by a MOU after listing the non-public schools in the LEAs/parish attendance zone.
- This helps keep the data accurate, services as a cross - reference and helps the LDOE staff review and approve the eGMS applications.

## IDEA Final Allocations

- We are in process of finalizing the data needed and will provide an update on the release of allocations on the eGMS Logon page as soon as they are available.

## 2023-24 Super App

- Funding (Formula and Competitive) will be available in eGMS on April 27, 2023.

## 2022-23 Amendments

- June 15, 2023: deadline to submit amendments for all grants ending June 30, 2023.

## Achieve!

- All ESSER II funding must be obligated on or before 9/30/2023.
- Claims for all expenditures must be submitted on or before 11/15/2023.
- 9/30 Final PER must be submitted on or before 11/15/2023.



# SPED Cameras

In May, the Department will launch a data collection tool in the eGMS SPED Camera application for school systems who received legislative funding allocations. Systems will have to create an amendment to the current application to populate the data report.

The collection will request

- How many parent requests for cameras have you received?
- How many parent requests have been approved?
- How much of your allocation have you spent in 2022-2023?
  - Receipts will have to be uploaded that match expenditures.

Data collection will be due May 31.



# Achieve

## **New Tab: Release of Funds**

- Release of Funds tab will be available on Friday, April 28, 2023.
- Release of Funds tab only applies to ESSER II Incentive and ESSER II School Choice funding.

## **When to use the Release of funds**

- If an LEA has incentive funds that will not be expended on or before September 30, 2023

**Deadline to Release Funds:** August 4, 2023

**Note:** If the Achieve application is in an “Approved” posture, an amendment will need to be created to utilize the Release of Funds page.



# Achieve

## Process for Release of Funds:

- LEA creates an amendment, completes the Release of Funds page indicating the amount to be released, and submits the amendment for approval. (Funding is not automatically removed from Allocations page.)
- On or before August 11, 2023, the reduction of funds indicated by the LEA will be completed in eGMS.
- LEA will create an amendment to adjust the budget detail and submit for approval.
