

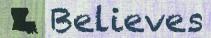




COVID-19 Updates

<u>COVID-19 Vaccines</u> - Children 6 months and older are now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.





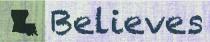
Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) Updates

Child Care Assistance Program Updates Inquiry Response Delays

Thank you for your patience in our delayed response to provider requests for assistance. We value all providers and are working diligently to address concerns as timely as possible. Response delays are due to staff shortages, an increase in CCAP applications, and an increase in provider queries.

Please allow additional time for our response. Continue to place concerns in the <u>Provider Ticket System</u>. There will be no adverse action on the family's case as a result of our delay.

Please have families submit all requested documents. CCAP staff will contact families as soon as possible. Again, thanks for partnering with the Child Care Assistance Program.




Child Care Assistance Program Updates 24-Month Certification Period

In an effort to provide continuity of care for children in the CCAP program and to address the large number of new CCAP applications, LDOE will extend CCAP eligibility to 24 months in total.

Pandemic application cases for essential workers will remain at the original 12 month period due to the specific source of funding for these cases. Cases for children already receiving 24 months of service because of their age will not be extended.

Therefore, beginning with July, cases will be extended by 12 months, not to exceed 24 months in total. At the 24 month mark, families will be notified via email that it is time for their redetermination to maintain child care with CCAP, if eligible. Providers are asked to help in notifying CCAP families of their redetermination.

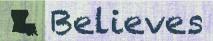
Child Care Assistance Program Updates Family Copayments

Beginning August 1, 2022, family copayments will be reinstated.

In response to COVID-19, family copayments were waived. **Beginning August 1, 2022, copayments will be reinstated.**

As a reminder, copayments listed on the "CCAP 12 - Provider Notice of Payment" correspondence are the parent's portion of the state daily rate which is deducted prior to issuance of regular weekly provider payments.

Example: The state's daily rate for a child, birth to 11 months, is \$68.00. The parent's copayment of the daily rate is \$2.00. The state will pay \$66.00 per day resulting in a weekly payment to the provider of \$330.00.

Licensing UpdatesReminder: Motor Vehicle Passenger Checks

May 1 was National Heat Stroke Day. The negative consequences of extreme heat are so significant that Louisiana has a law prohibiting leaving children unattended in a vehicle. A first offense for leaving a child under the age of six unattended or unsupervised in a car will net a fine of up to \$500 or imprisonment up to six months or both. Each subsequent offense will can result in felony imprisonment for no less than one year and a fine of no less than \$1,000.

As required in <u>Bulletin 137</u> §2017, Motor Vehicle Passenger Checks, it is imperative that vehicles are adequately inspected for children before staff exit the vehicle, especially as temperatures rise outside. Children can die in a hot vehicle in a matter of minutes. <u>Heat stroke</u> can happen when the outside temperature is as low as 57 degrees Fahrenheit.



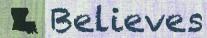
Licensing Updates

Reminder: Motor Vehicle Passenger Checks

A visual passenger check of a vehicle is required to ensure that no child is left in the vehicle.

A staff person shall

- physically walk through the vehicle and inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats, and in all enclosed spaces and recesses of the interior of the vehicle.
- record the time of the visual passenger check and sign the log, indicating that no child was left in the vehicle.



Licensing UpdatesReminder: Motor Vehicle Passenger Checks

During all field trips, a visual inspection is required for vehicles used to transport children if the vehicle is provided by the center, a contractual arrangement, or parent provided.

Each vehicle shall have a vehicle passenger check and a face-to-name count conducted at each of the following times:

- 1. prior to leaving center for destination;
- 2. upon arrival at and prior to departure from each destination; and
- 3. upon return to center.




Licensing UpdatesReminder: Child to Staff Ratio Update

Effective July 1, 2022, the child-to-staff ratio for two-year-olds decreased to 10:1.

Below is the current child to staff ratio for all license types.


Age of Child	Ratio

Licensing UpdatesEmergency Preparedness

With the recent school shooting at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, the Department encourages you to revisit and practice your lockdown procedures. The Department also recommends that you ask your local <u>Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness</u> to review your emergency preparedness plan. In addition, <u>Child Care Aware</u> has good resources and training for a variety of crisis and disaster situations. The <u>Institute for Childhood Preparedness</u> has resources on active shooter preparedness as well.

There will be two sessions at the Early Childhood Conference provided by The Institute for Childhood Preparedness. One session will be on Situational Awareness and the other on De-escalation Techniques. The LDOE will also provide several opportunities this fall for in-person Active Shooter Preparedness trainings which will be held across the state. More information will be forthcoming.





Child Care Criminal Background Checks (CCCBCs)

Child Care Criminal Background Checks (CCCBCs) Out-of-State Changes

Missouri, Colorado, and South Dakota are now requiring that background information be sent to the applicant instead of directly to the Department as the state agency:

- This may delay the time for applicants from those states to be made eligible.
- This will also force the applicant to make sure the paperwork is sent to the Louisiana Department of Education's CCCBC Unit once it is received by the applicant.

The Department is currently working on a resolution with these outside state agencies.


Until this issue is resolved, please note that the applicant will need to provide the Department's CCCBC Unit with the documentation.



Child Care Criminal Background Checks Fees Reinstated

In response to COVID-19, the Department had been covering Child Care Criminal Background Check fees and family copayments. Beginning July 1, 2022, these fees were reinstated as they were prior to the pandemic.




EdLink Updates

The Department is excited to announce that EdLink Licensing will be live soon.

The Department is gradually adding providers as each center's renewal date approaches. This will begin with August and September renewals. Those with renewals in August and September will be contacted by the Division of Licensing.

As a reminder, the TOTS machines or IVR must continue to be used to track attendance until we have converted over to EdLink for the Child Care Assistance Program. We anticipate that that transition will occur in early fall.



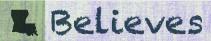
Teaching and Learning Updates Talking with Children about Traumatic Events

Teaching and Learning Updates Performance Profile Data Certification

Data Certification is a critical process that allows each site to ensure that self-reported informational metrics are accurately captured and reflected in their annual Performance Profile.

- Data Certification captures various informational metrics as reported in the CLASS® Portal, rolled up at the network, site, and classroom-level.
- Community network lead agencies work with programs to verify information.
- All informational metrics should reflect what was true on October 1, 2021, unless otherwise specified.
- If a classroom was open October 1, informational metrics should still be reported even if the information changed or the classroom closed before the end of the year.
- All data, for all sites and classrooms, must be certified by community network lead agencies in the Louisiana Data Review system and will be reported in the 2022-2023 Performance Profiles.

Programs should provide any needed corrections to their community network lead agency in July.



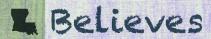

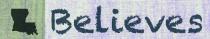

Interrater Reliability Certification

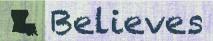
The Interrater Reliability Certification is an online certification process that gives educators the opportunity to ensure the accuracy of their ratings by evaluating and assigning levels to the documentation in sample child portfolios.

Interrater Reliability Certification

- increases the accuracy and consistency of your preliminary and checkpoint ratings,
- improves planning for individual children by helping you assess children accurately, and
- identifies professional development needs by using data collected during the certification process.


Please note that there is *no cost* for IRR certification and it is *valid for three years*.

While not required by the Department at this time, it is recommended that all administrators and instructional coaches of publicly-funded early childhood programs maintain IRR certification records for all staff to ensure the validity and reliability of GOLD® data.





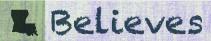
Upcoming Events Early Childhood Investigations Webinar






