




Is Type III the Right License for Me?

As you are considering which license type to select for your center, we want to provide you with information about why a Type III license may be the right next step for you. By choosing to be a Type III license, your center will be able to serve publicly-funded children, participate in the state's early childhood care and education network, and receive many improvement resources and funding opportunities. Becoming a Type III early learning center provides a valuable service to your community, helps families grow their careers, and demonstrates a commitment to quality improvement.



Economically Disadvantaged Children and Access to Quality Care and Education

Despite the gains that the Department has made to improve program quality, the state has yet to ensure that all families needing early childhood care and education have access to quality options. Even though the state serves about 90 percent of its economically disadvantaged four-year-old children, it reaches just 30 percent of its economically disadvantaged threeyear-old children and even fewer birth through age two children who are economically disadvantaged.

Type III is the only license type that can serve children through the Child Care

Assistance Program or foster children. The other types of licenses prohibit a center from receiving many publicly-funded benefits and from accepting publicly-funded children.

Туре І	Early learning centers owned or operated by a tax exempt faith-based organization and receive no state or federal funds directly or indirectly from any source
Туре II	Early learning centers not accepting public funding, unless they are nonprofit and therefore eligible for the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)
Type III	Early learning centers authorized to accept some form of public funding to serve in- need children (Child Care Assistance or CCAP, Head Start funds, or NSECD monies)

Type III centers agree to meet the performance and academic standards of the Early Childhood Care and Education Network regarding kindergarten readiness.

- Implement Louisiana's Early Learning and Development Standards;
- Allow teachers to be observed using the CLASS tool;
- Ensure lead teachers obtain at least a CDA level credential within two years through an approved program;
- Count all publicly-funded birth to five children in October and February; and
- Attend parish-level meetings with other providers to coordinate engagement and support.





By agreeing to these standards, Type III centers benefit from:

- Membership in a collaborative community network of child care, Head Start, and pre-K providers;
- Participation in the state's early childhood unified quality rating and improvement system; and
- Opportunities to receive public funding and incentives, participate in grants and tax credits, and be marketed to families with the center's quality rating information via <u>www.louisianaschools.com</u>.

Type III centers benefit from a wide variety of incentives that benefit directors, families, teachers and children.
