

WHO ARE LOUISIANA HEALTHY SCHOOLS?

Louisiana Healthy Schools' aim is to improve student health and academic achievement through nutrition, physical activity and the management of students' chronic health conditions. In partnership with Well-Ahead Louisiana, Louisiana Healthy Schools utilizes the Whole School Whole Community Whole Child (WSCC) model as a framework for addressing health in schools. With federal funding, the Louisiana Healthy Schools supports healthier schools through:

- strengthening **statewide infrastructure** through school health councils,
- delivering statewide professional development,
- providing funding and technical assistance to local educational agencies (LEA),
- · collaborating with non-governmental organizations to complement and strengthen the work, and
- collecting data to inform decision making and evidence based strategies.



Launched the Healthy Schools Training Krewe to deliver professional development. Convened the 13 member Louisiana School Health Advisory Council. Funded six LEAs, Healthy Schools Communities, to drive local change.

Development of a Comprehensive School Health Advisory Council Guidebook. Assist 6 LEAs (Calcasieu, Lafayette, St. Landry, City of Monroe, East Baton Rouge, Tangipahoa) with Sustaining Physical Education, Nutrition and Chronic Health Policies and Practices, in an effort to promote state-wide

WHAT SUCCESS HAS LOUISIANA HEALTHY SCHOOLS HAD?

- Increasing Access to Quality Professional Development
 Since 2016, the Healthy Schools Training Krewe expanded to a 14 member cadre of expert trainers.
 By providing resources and technical assistance to Lafayette, they created the infrastructure to support water bottle filling stations for 11 schools. This project
- Assessment of Youth Risk Behavior Survelliance System (YRBSS)

In 2019, the Department utilized the YRBS to survey High School Students on health-related behaviors.

- 3. Delivered Quality Professional Development and Technical Assistance for LEAs Statewide
- a. 95% of Professional Development attendees report skill increase
- b. Professional Development has reached over half the state
- c. Techincal Assistance has reached 1/3 of LEAs
- 4. By providing resources and technical assistance to Lafayette, they created the infrastructure to support water bottle filling stations for 11 schools. This project inspired State Representative Vincent Pierre to introduce a resolution during the recent Legislative session (HR-15) that calls upon the Louisiana Department of Education and the state Uniform Construction Code Council to "identify solutions and resources necessary to install water bottle filling stations during new construction and renovation projects at public and secondary schools."

WHAT'S NEXT FOR LOUISIANA HEALTHY SCHOOLS?

The Department will focus on:

- Expanding the number of schools within funded LEAs that are building sustainable school
 health programs through school health councils, assessing current health practices, and
 implementation of action plans.
- Increasing the reach of the Healthy Schools Training Krewe's professional development and expand the offering of trainings to additional content areas (health education, asthma, diabetes, etc.).
- Utilizing process and outcome evaluation to develop a model of success for all LEAs and their schools to improve the health and academic achievement of Louisiana students.
