


WHAT IS QUEST FOR SUCCESS?

Quest for Success is now available to all Louisiana school systems who attend official LDOE sponsored training. In 2020-2021 all other career preparation courses besides Quest for Success, JAG, Agriscience, Career Success Skills, Propel Core Skills, and OneGoal will sunset. Quest for Success will be the primary career preparation and career education course for the state. Once it is fully implemented, Quest for Success will be a model curriculum for schools across the country.

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
