### WHAT IS A READY START NETWORK?

Ready Start Networks were created by the Louisiana Department of Education and approved by the state Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to increase access to high-quality early childhood care and education at the local level.

#### Ready Start Networks' access aims include:

- Assessing local demand for high-quality early care and education
- Developing blueprints, or strategic plans, focused on increasing quality and access within the communities served
- Recruiting and engaging stakeholders as part of local early childhood coalitions that are tasked with increasing community knowledge and awareness of the importance of early care and education
- Establishing and sustaining local advisory councils to lead collaborative decision-making and strategic planning related to community-level early childhood initiatives
- Identifying local funding to support access for high-quality early childhood care and education at the local level
