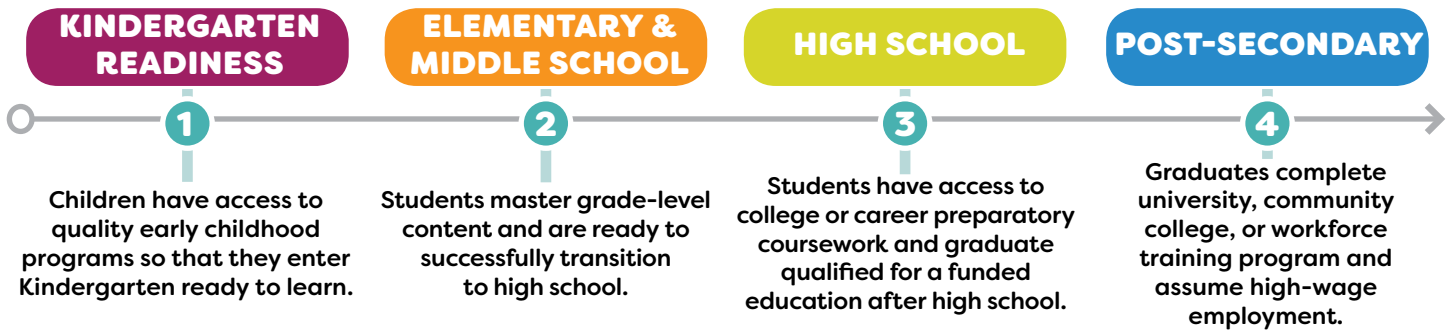

**#1 OVERALL STATE GROWTH IN 4TH GRADE READING**



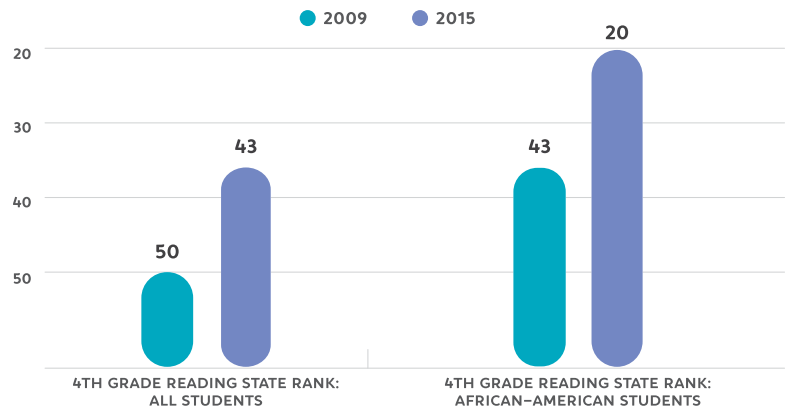
**#2 OVERALL STATE GROWTH IN 4TH GRADE MATH**

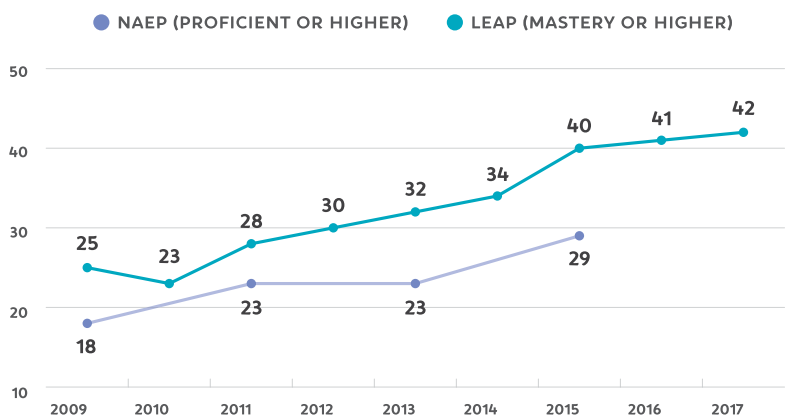
### LEAP

4TH GRADE READING LEAP VS. NAEP COMPARISON



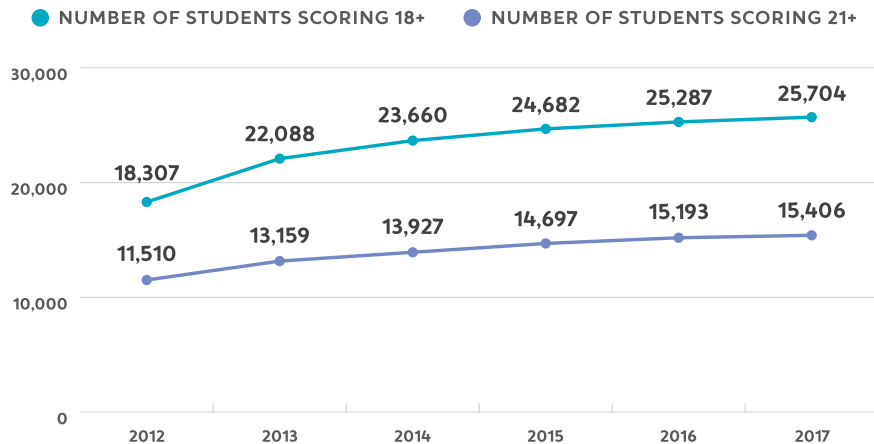
## College and Career Readiness Success

### ACT

The number of students earning a college-going score of at least 18 has increased by **6,980** since 2012, and the number of students scoring 21 or above has increased by **3,896**.

Of the 17 states that test all students, **Louisiana ranked 10th** in 2017, and had the **third highest average composite score** of the southern states testing 100% of their students.

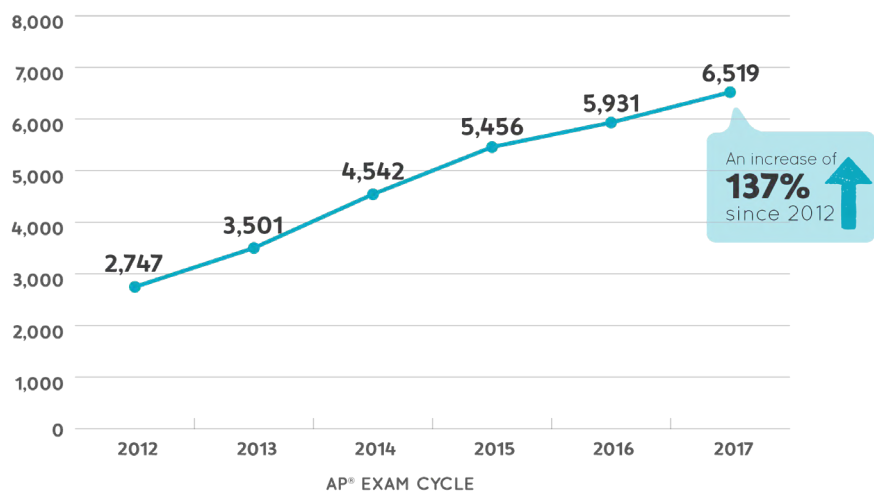

### AP

Since 2012, the number of students earning Advanced Placement credit each year has increased by more than **3,700**, an increase of more than **137 percent**.

More students graduated in 2016 than ever before with a graduation rate of **77%**. An increase of over **3,400** students since 2012.

### COLLEGE ENROLLMENT

The rate of students enrolling in college is also on the rise, with **58%** of students enrolling in 2015.
