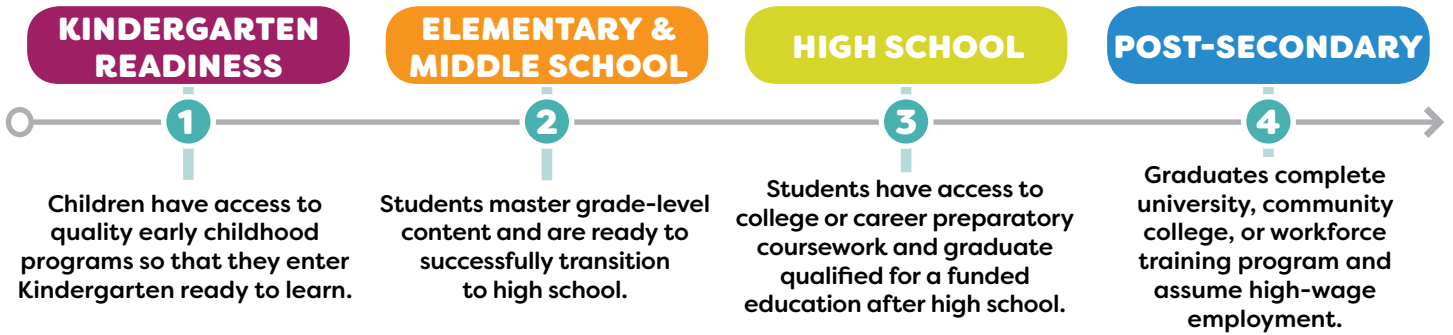

LOUISIANA'S 2025 VISION

In order for students to enter each level of Louisiana's education system with the knowledge and skills to be successful, our state must raise the bar for what it means for schools to be rated an "A". By 2025, schools will earn an "A" when:

In 2015, Louisiana's 4th grade students demonstrated the **largest state growth in the country** on the NAEP's reading and math tests.

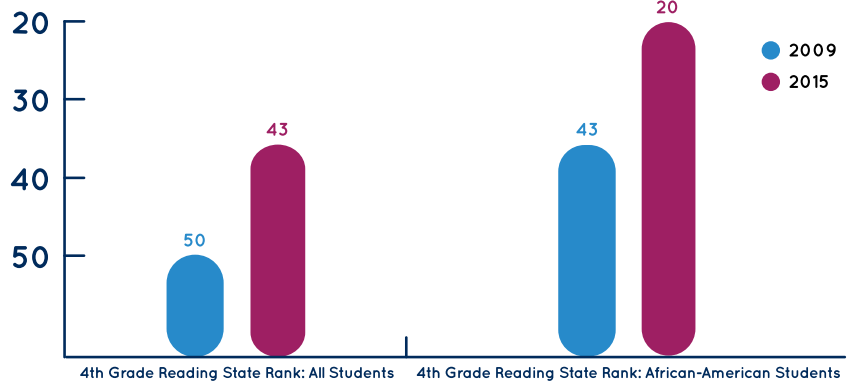


OVERALL STATE GROWTH IN 4TH GRADE READING

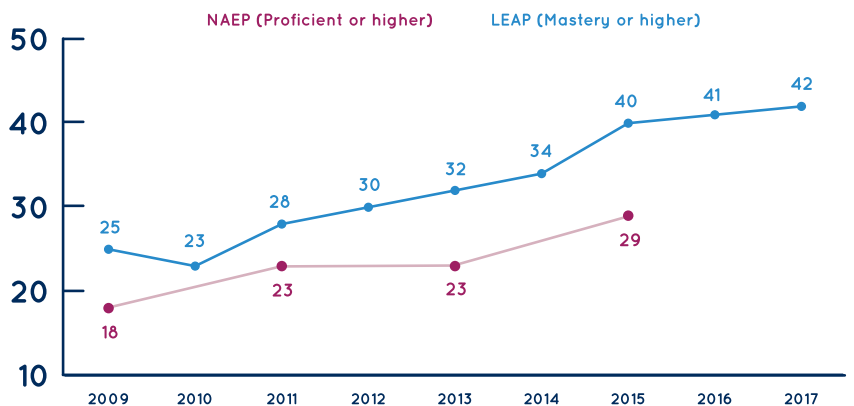


OVERALL STATE GROWTH IN 4TH GRADE MATH

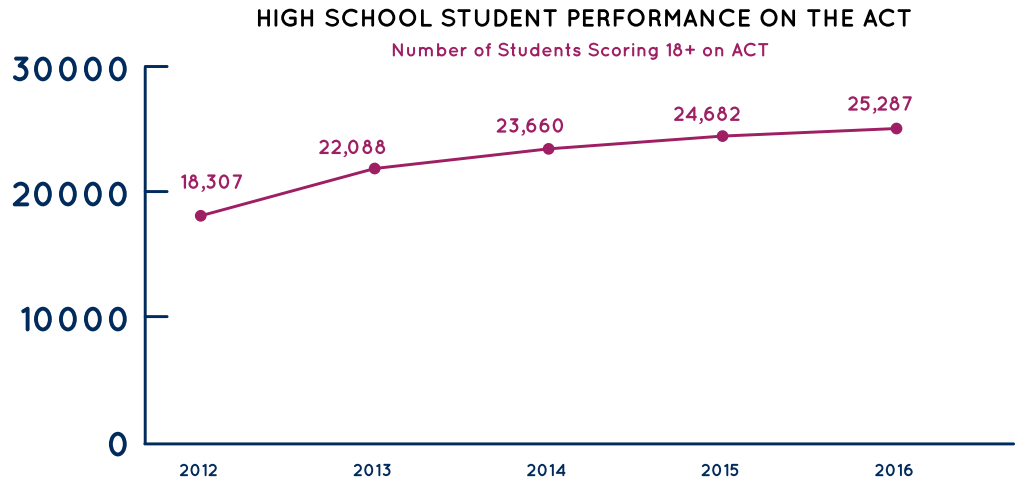
Since 2009, the number of students scoring Mastery and above has increased **17%** proving that our students are just as a smart, and just as capable, as any in the country.

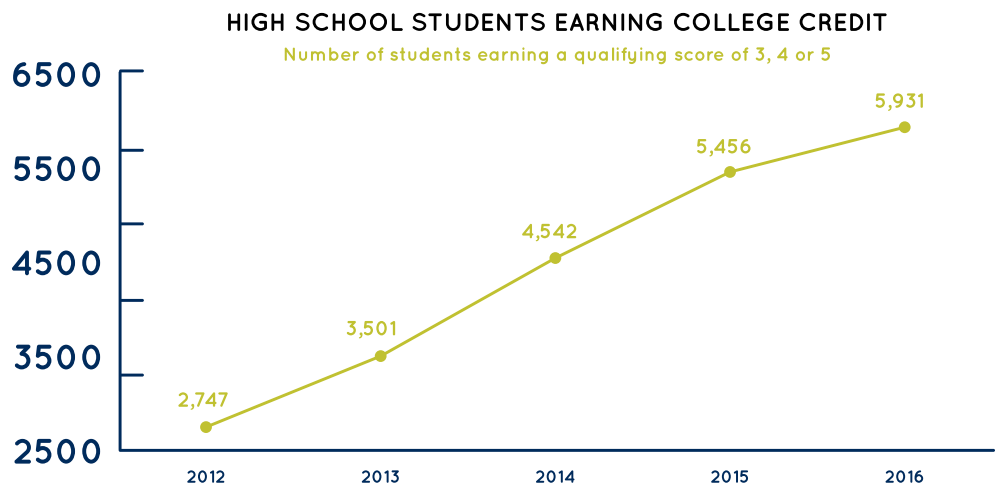
Of the southern states that test all students, Louisiana has the **third highest average composite score** and has the **largest composite score growth** in the last three years.

AP

Since 2012, the number of students earning Advanced Placement credit each year has increased by more than **3,000**, an increase of more than **100** percent.

GRADUATION RATE

More students graduated in 2016 than ever before with a graduation rate of **77%**. An increase of over **3,400** students since 2012.

WORKFORCE READY

22% of the Class of 2015 graduated with an industry-based credential in one of the state's high growth, high wage industries.

COLLEGE ENROLLMENT

The rate of students enrolling in college is also on the rise, with **58%** of students enrolling in 2015.
