Margaret Acree holds a Bachelor of Science in mathematics and a Master of Education in curriculum and instruction with a concentration in gifted education from the University of Louisiana at Monroe. For the past fourteen years, she has taught Algebra II, precalculus, and calculus at Sterlington High School in Ouachita Parish. A mathematics teacher for twenty years, Ms. Acree has also taught sixth- through eighth-grade mathematics. She serves as department head in her school and in a number of capacities at the district level that include leading in-services, textbook adoption and alignment committees, and new initiatives. She presents at conferences sponsored by the Louisiana Department of Education, the Louisiana Association for Teachers of Mathematics, and the Southern Region Education Board. Ms. Acree is the 2019 Louisiana Awardee for the Presidential Award for Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST). She has previously served as a Teacher Leader Advisor.

Additionally, she has received recognition for her service, receiving the College of Human Sciences and Education Faculty Service Award (2016) and the Louisiana Champions of Service Volunteer of the Year: Plantation Region (2013). Dr. DiCarlo has incorporated her passion for research into the courses she teaches and her work in mentoring undergraduate and graduate students. Since its inception in 2014, Dr. DiCarlo has mentored 67 undergraduate students who have subsequently presented at LSU Discover Day. She currently serves on the editorial boards for Infants & Young Children and for the Journal of Teacher Action Research.

Tiffany Doerr

Tiffany Doerr holds a Master of Arts in educational leadership from Mississippi College and is currently pursuing a Doctor of Philosophy in curriculum and instruction at Louisiana State University.
