Louisiana Scholarship Program (LSP) News

New: DRC Online Cleanup Window Closes 6/15

DRC is now open for the Online Cleanup System (OCS) until June 15. **This is the only opportunity that school systems and schools will have to apply accountability codes to impending zeroes before the new progress index is calculated.** The system will include student records from LEAP 2025, EOC, LEAP Connect, and LAA 1. School systems should not wait until the August data certification period to address impending zeroes.

Failure to properly update this information in DRC from 6/11 to 6/15 may impact a school's Scholarship Cohort Index (SCI) or Proficiency Rate.

New: Supplemental Payments Approved for 2017-18 School Year

On May 31st, the LDOE communicated to schools that the Legislature had approved a supplemental appropriation for the Louisiana Scholarship Program for the 2017-18 school year. Recently this supplemental appropriation was signed by the Governor, meaning all schools will receive full funding for their Scholarship students for 2017-18.

Schools can expect to receive their supplemental payments by early next week. The exact timing of the payment may vary for schools depending on the bank used.

New: 2018-19 Transfer Window Opened

Families that wish to transfer their Scholarship award from one school to another may complete the attached [transfer form](#). The school leader or Scholarship contact of the student's new school must sign off on the transfer and submit to studentscholarships@la.gov. Transfer forms must be submitted by the school--forms submitted by parents will not be accepted.

Completion of the transfer form is not a guarantee that a transfer will be granted. Schools can not exceed their student enrollment caps. Additionally, newly-awarded students must have accepted their award by the May 25th deadline in order to be eligible for a transfer. Families should not buy uniforms or other supplies until the Department has approved the transfer.

New: ACT/WorkKeys MOU

The Department has executed and posted a [new data sharing agreement](#) with ACT for other realms in the [Data Sharing Agreement Library](#). This agreement allows ACT to deliver WorkKeys data from non-LDOE realms directly to the Department, eliminating the need to submit individual WorkKeys documentation for students during the August data certification period.

School systems wishing to participate should download the [addendum](#), sign, scan, and email the signed copy to LDEData@la.gov no later than Friday, June 29 in order for the WorkKeys data to be applied to the ACT rosters delivered to school systems in August.

Reminder: Important Information for District Testing Coordinators

General

- All changes to district test coordinators (DTCs) or accountability contacts must be submitted to the Department using the [DTC and Accountability Contact Update](#) form found in the Assessment Library.
- On June 28, DRC will release an updated version of its DRC INSIGHT secure browser software. This is a required update, and it applies to all operating systems (Windows, MacOS, ChromeOS, and iOS). You will need to update to this latest version to complete any LEAP 2025 or LEAP 360 testing after June 28. If you configured your devices to auto-update when you installed INSIGHT, the software will automatically download and install this update upon launch. If you did not configure INSIGHT to auto-update, you will need to manually install INSIGHT before completing any testing.

LEAP 360

- LEAP 360 will close for the 2017-2018 school year on June 18. Diagnostic and Interim test setup for 2018-2019 will be available on July 16 in [eDIRECT](#).
- LEAP 360 Interim Assessment District Item Response Files, School Test Session Summary Reports, and Test Session Summary Reports were posted for all forms on May 22. The remaining scheduled posting will be June 18.
- [A District's Guide to LEAP 360](#) serves as support tool for school systems to use when implementing the components of LEAP 360 in schools. School systems should use this guide and its resources to develop a plan for LEAP 360 training, administration, and data analysis and to guide instructional and assessment planning in schools.
- Updates have been made to [A Teacher's Guide to LEAP 360](#) to improve LEAP 360 instruction and implementation. The document is posted to the [Assessment Library](#).
- The new [Parent Guide to LEAP 360](#) can be used to facilitate communication between educators and parents is now available. Translated versions in Arabic, Spanish, and Vietnamese are also available.
- School systems that signed a LEAP 360 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the 2017-2018 school year may choose to continue using LEAP 360 through June 30, 2019, under the same terms and conditions. To opt-in and amend your school system's existing agreement, each Superintendent must sign an [amendment](#) to the original agreement and return an electronic copy to assessment@la.gov by July 7. LEAP Connect and LAA 1

- Beginning August 1, the English Language Proficiency Screener (ELPS) will be available for school system use. The ELPS is a tool to determine if students entering Kindergarten through grade 12 are English learners (ELs) who require supplementary support services to continue developing language proficiency in English. Students who do not score proficient on the ELPS will be identified as an EL and can receive an [EL Accommodations Plan](#). [Donor credit reports](#) are required to be submitted at the conclusion of the Spring application process. STOs may also submit donor credit reports prior to the required deadlines. STOs should submit this report via the secure FTP site and notify LDOE personnel when the report has been submitted. The LDOE uses this information in the Donor Credit Report to prepare appropriate tax credit documentation.

STO's will receive the verified prior school checks within one week. The next prior school check information should be turned in by STOs by Tuesday, June 26th. These will be returned to STOs by Tuesday, July 3rd.

Reminder: Correctly Coding Courses in Student Transcript System (STS)

Please share with school leaders, and counselors.

As processing begins for the graduating class of 2018, it has been observed that courses qualifying for the TOPS weighted GPA are being coded incorrectly in the Student Transcript System (STS). This error could affect students' TOPS GPA, possibly resulting in students being found ineligible or awarded the incorrect level of TOPS.

For example, if the course is English IV: Honors, the course code that should be used is 120342. If it is entered as 120334 English IV and typed in as a 5.00 scale course, the system will not recognize the course as a 5.00 course. The course will only be counted as a 4.00 course.

Data managers for STS should download the validation reports, analyze the data and make any necessary corrections in the source systems. This will help identify any issues before the systems close.
