Louisiana Scholarship Program

Application Process

The application process for 2022-23 scholarship began on December 13th for schools outside of Orleans parish. Schools play a central role in the applicant intake process by verifying eligibility as well as providing direct support to families.

- Schools are not allowed to implement admissions criteria for Scholarship applicants and may not discriminate against students with special needs during the admissions process.
- Schools are required to accept the grade of the sending school for all students awarded a Scholarship.

Now more than ever, the Department recognizes that student health plays a vital role in education and that school health service providers are the critical link in ensuring health service delivery to students. Annually, the Department honors the state's most exceptional educators through the Teacher and Principal of the Year programs. These programs provide an opportunity to acknowledge educators who are achieving excellence.

This year, the Department is launching the <u>School Health Service Provider of the Year</u> program which will recognize and celebrate some of the state's most exceptional school health service providers. This program provides an opportunity to recognize school health providers who are demonstrating superior provision of health services in schools and supporting the expansion of health services in schools.

The Department is inviting nominations of any of the following school employees or contractors: occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech-language pathologists, audiologists, nurses, nurse practitioners, licensed practical nurses and behavioral health providers (LCSW/LMSW, LPC, psychologists). Nominees will be evaluated and interviewed based on a <u>rubric</u> and 4 finalists and one winner will be honored at the 16th Annual Cecil J. Picard Educator Excellence Awards Gala. Quality Science and Mathematics (QSM) Grant Opportunity Round 2

The QSM Grant Program was established for the purpose of providing Louisiana public school teachers with non-consumable classroom materials and equipment in math, science, and STEM.

- Full-time classroom teachers assigned to teach math, science, or STEM courses in PreK-12 public regular education programs including public charter schools are invited to apply.
- Applications may be submitted via the QSM grant portal as of January 24.
- The application deadline is March 7 at 11:59 p.m.
- \$1,000 grants are available for Pre-K-3 teachers and up to \$1,500 grants for 4-12 teachers.
- Applications must demonstrate that the grant materials will enhance the quality of instruction for regular education students enrolled in mathematics, science or STEM classes within the normal school day. After-school, Talented & Gifted, and Special Education programs are not eligible.

State Performance Plan (SSP) Target Setting Process

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires states to have a plan that describes and evaluates its efforts to implement the requirements of IDEA and how the state will improve implementation. This plan is known as the State Performance Plan (SPP). Each year, states must report against targets set in its SPP in an annual performance report, or APR.

States have entered a new SPP/APR cycle and are required to set new annual targets for FFY 2020 through FFY 2025. Stakeholders can participate in the SPP/APR target setting process by reviewing the SPP/APR Target Setting Overview document and completing the SPP/APR Target Setting Setting
