


Important News for **NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS**



October 21, 2021

Dear Colleagues,

The Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) is currently revising the K-12 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies. The major goals of this revision include balancing the acquisition of content knowledge with disciplinary skills, creating a more coherent sequence of content, and better integrating the historical perspectives of people from all different backgrounds.

This process has involved a great deal of collaboration between the Department, Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE), educators, and other community stakeholders. A group of K-12 content experts has been drafting revised social studies standards since March. These standards were then endorsed by the Social Studies Standards Steering Committee, which is composed of a diverse group of Louisiana teachers, educational leaders, parents, students, and community members.

The next stage involves gathering input from the educational community and the public at large. This comment period has recently been extended through November 30 to further ensure transparency and allow the public additional time to share their views about the ongoing standards review. I urge you to share this information within your communities and give us your feedback. One way you can do this is through LDOE's [online social studies comment portal](#), which allows you to review the current and revised standards as well as provide comments.

A review of these standards is both long overdue and essential to our students' ability to understand our nation's history and the role they'll play in shaping its future. Students deserve to learn an accurate account of our civics, economics, geography, and history that is free from indoctrination. It is our duty as citizens to educate our students on what a truly exceptional nation America is. Public feedback is a critical component of this process, as this input will guide further revisions of the standards before their final submission to BESE.

You must use Google chrome to complete the jotforms. If you encounter any issues with the jotforms or have questions, please contact us directly at studentscholarships@la.gov for assistance.

- Important notes for continuing Scholarship schools: If you only wish to keep your current Scholarship students, you must **STILL** complete this NOI but mark that you would not like to accept new students.
- Please note that due to recent legislation, the 20% enrollment cap for new schools is no longer in place. Additionally, schools must be accredited or provisionally accredited by: Southern Association of Colleges and Schools accreditation organizations, the Cognia accreditation organizations, the National Association of Independent Schools accreditation organizations, the Louisiana Montessori Association, and the diocese or archdiocese in which the school is located.

- Please remember:
 - Schools are not allowed to implement admissions criteria for Scholarship applicants, and may not discriminate against students with special needs during the admissions process.
 - Schools are required to accept the grade of the sending school for all students awarded a Scholarship.
- The application process for 2022-23 scholarships will begin **November 1st for schools in Orleans Parish**. Families applying for schools in Orleans Parish enter their applications into OneApp, the parish-wide unified enrollment process. For details about OneApp, visit www.enrollnola.org

The annual data reporting deadline was **October 15th**. This information is used to ensure approved schools receive equitable services from the school district as well as funding purposes such as textbook allocations. **If you have not submitted your report please do so as quickly as possible.**

If the school system does not wish to apply for Achieve! Incentive funds, please log into the eGMS application and place zeros, blanks, or N/A in the respective response fields. This allows the agency to maintain records of which school systems would like to be considered and which have opted out.

LEAP 2025

- October 1-31: School systems will verify grade 3-8 enrollment and indicate their selection of paper-based or computer-based testing for grade 3 in the Enrollment function of DRC INSIGHT. There is no paper-based testing option for grade 4 in spring 2022. Paper tests will remain available in grades other than 3 as a unique accommodation that will require department approval.
 - All grade 3 subject tests taken with paper will have accommodated forms this year. It is very important that students who have TRA, TTS, braille, communication assistance scripts, transferred answers, and large print use only the appropriate accommodated forms.

- October 25: Manuals posted and DRC test setup opens for high schools testing in Window A

Observation Requirement Updates

BESE approved a proposal moving through the formal rulemaking process this October **for the 2021-2022 academic year only** regarding the number of required observations. Only one formal observation for the 2021-2022 academic year is required for those who earn a rating of Highly Effective or Effective: Proficient (score of 2.5 or higher) on the first observation. Individuals earning Highly Effective or Effective: Proficient on the first observation shall receive a second observation upon request.

Any teacher or administrator who earns an observation rating of Ineffective or Effective: Emerging (2.4 or lower) will require two observations.

Nutrition Support

2021 National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance Grants

USDA has awarded Louisiana \$604,377, provided by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021, to be distributed to School Food Authorities (SFA's) participating in the NSLP to purchase equipment to serve healthier meals, improve food safety, and to help support the establishment, maintenance, or expansion of the School Breakfast Program. Only those entities that participate in the NSLP will have access to the online grant application for these funds. Schools approved for participation in the NSLP that participate(d) in Seamless Summer Option (SSO) and/or the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) as part of COVID-19 flexibilities are eligible to apply for the grant opportunity. Priority will be given to schools where the greatest percentage of enrolled students are eligible for free or reduced price meals.

NAEP

- The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) will proceed with administration of the mandated mathematics and reading assessments. For 2022, at the state level, the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) will be administered in mathematics and reading at grades 4 and 8. The NAEP 2022 school sample will represent the 2022 student population while also maximizing overlap with the NAEP 2021 school sample. Maximizing the overlapping school samples between NAEP 2022 and 2021 opens up the possibility of studying student performance, as measured by NAEP, within the unique context provided by the two NAEP studies that were administered in the 2020–2021 school year.
- The NAEP 2022 administration will include three assessment programs:
 - **January 10 to March 18, 2022:** National long-term trend mathematics and reading assessments: age 9
 - **January 24 to March 4, 2022:**
 - State-level mathematics and reading assessments: grades 4 and 8
 - National civics and U.S. history assessments: grade 8
- Superintendents of selected school systems will receive a letter through email in September.
 - School systems will play an important role by supporting participation.
 - NAEP will continue to adapt to new processes and procedures as the situation with COVID-19 continues to evolve.
 - As in previous years, NAEP representatives will provide significant support to schools by administering the assessment and bringing all necessary materials and equipment, including sanitized tablets, on which students take the assessment.
 - NAEP representatives' top priority is to protect the health and safety of students and
