Message from the Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

We released <u>2023 school and district performance scores</u> Monday. I'm pleased to announce Louisiana now exceeds its pre-pandemic performance score after two consecutive years of growth. Our 2023 statewide score increased 1.4 points to 78.5. In addition to improving our overall score, we also saw growth in key indicators. These results come one year after we <u>matched the pre-pandemic score of 77.1</u>.

We also released <u>Early Childhood Performance Profiles</u>. The latest early childhood data shows instructional and engaged support for learning scores increased to record highs. These are the highest scores ever for all site types, with the most growth occurring in child care. The quantity of excellent rated sites continues to increase, even as the number of early learning sites has increased by 13%.

Louisiana has faced unprecedented disruptions over the past few years. These scores are a testament to the efforts of so many people across our state. I'm encouraged to see our statewide performance score surpass pre-pandemic levels and clearly recognize work remains to accelerate academic outcomes.

Our newsletter will take a break next week as schools close for Thanksgiving. I want to wish you and your family a blessed Thanksgiving. I am thankful for you and the entire educational community in Louisiana.

2023-2024 Louisiana Scholarship Program Audits

The audit process for all schools participating in the Louisiana Scholarship Program (LSP) is underway. All schools should provide timely, informative materials and communications as necessary during the process. The audits are a statute requirement and each LSP school is required to participate.

2024-2025 Louisiana Scholarship Program Application

The application for 2024-2025 Louisiana Scholarship Program will open on December 11, 2023 and close on January 19, 2024.

All families (including Orleans) who need to submit applications for the 2024-2025 school year must apply using the LDOE website. Parents will be able to access the <u>application</u> on December 11th on our website.

- New applicants, students who wish to transfer to another participating scholarship school for the upcoming year, and those in a terminal grade will need to submit an application for the 2024-2025 school year.
- We will be hosting two upcoming webinars to discuss the application process for the upcoming year.
 - A School LSP Application for 2024-2025 Webinar will be held on <u>December 4th at 2pm</u>. This webinar will provide guidance on the application process for participating schools.

FY 2023-2024 Nonpublic Textbook Allocation

Alternate Assessment Waiver for Public Comment

Under the requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the LDOE must limit the number of students who are assessed statewide on alternate assessments to 1.0 percent of the total number of students who are required to participate. The LDOE intends to seek a waiver for the 2023-2024 school year for this federal requirement that would limit the number of students in the state who participate in alternate assessments.
