2023-2024 Louisiana Scholarship Program Audits

The audit process for all schools participating in the Louisiana Scholarship Program (LSP) is underway. All schools should provide timely, informative materials and communications as necessary during the process. The audits are a statute requirement and each LSP school is required to participate.

2024-2025 Louisiana Scholarship Program Application

The application for 2024-2025 Louisiana Scholarship Program will open on December 11, 2023 and close on January 19, 2024.

All families (including Orleans) who need to submit applications for the 2024-2025 school year must apply using the LDOE website. Parents will be able to access the <u>application</u> on December 11th on our <u>website</u>.

- New applicants, students who wish to transfer to another participating scholarship school for the upcoming year, and those in a terminal grade will need to submit an application for the 2024-2025 school year.
- We will be hosting two upcoming webinars to discuss the application process for the upcoming year.
 - A School LSP Application for 2024-2025 Webinar will be held on <u>December 4th at 2pm</u>. This webinar will provide guidance on the application process for participating schools.

Assessment, Accountability, and Analytics

Gifted Evaluation Report

Please share with special education directors and testing coordinators.

Per state law, school systems must report the number of students who were referred for gifted evaluation as a result of their literacy screening score. Each school system must complete and submit the K-3 Literacy Screener form by **November 17**. The data captured will include the following for grades K-3:

- Number of students who have a gifted classification
- Number of students who do not have a gifted classification and have been referred for additional gifted screening
- Number of students who do not have a gifted classification and have been referred for gifted evaluation

2023-2024 Dyslexia Reporting

Act 419 (2021) requires school systems to annually report the number of students with dyslexia currently enrolled in their systems or the number of students newly identified with dyslexia in the prior school year. Act 622 (2022) updated the reporting deadline requirement from October 31 to December 15 annually. All school systems should submit the Dyslexia Reporting form by 5 p.m. **December 15**. Guidance on dyslexia reporting is available in the Students with Disabilities library.
