Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT and ELPT Connect) Please share with school leaders and testing coordinators.

Please submit any requests for exemption for the listening or speaking domains of the assessment to assessment@la.gov no later than January 9. The LDOE does not permit exemptions from reading or writing, and will review IEPs to determine that the student qualifies for an exemption based on a significant disability.

To participate in ELPT Connect, students must qualify for alternate assessments. There will continue to be a second scorer process at selected sites.

K-3 Literacy Screener Field Testing

Zearn Impact Study

Please share with system leaders.

As part of <u>Louisiana's Math Refresh</u>, the LDOE is continuing to partner with researchers to analyze the 2023-2024 impact of Zearn Math on student math achievement in our state. A <u>2022 analysis</u> of the impact of school system partnerships with Zearn Math shows that students who consistently used Zearn scored an average of six points higher on the 2022 LEAP test than matched peers who did not use Zearn.

To proceed with the 2023-2024 analysis, the LDOE needs consent to share data. The Zearn team, together with the LDOE, will manage the analysis. Superintendents should complete the Zearn - Impact Analysis Addendum for LEA opt-in and submit the signed agreement to the LDOE by uploading or emailing ldoedata@la.gov by January 12.

System leaders who signed the 2022 Zearn Impact Analysis Addendum must sign a new 2023 addendum to participate.
