# Message from the Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

Louisiana was recently recognized for our state's comprehensive early literacy policy. Excel*in*Ed's new <u>Early Literacy</u> <u>Matters</u> resource rates <u>Louisiana</u> as one of only three states taking action on all 18 of the organization's early literacy fundamental principles.

The report found it noteworthy that Louisiana requires all school systems and schools to develop a literacy plan and provides guidance for creation of these plans through several resources. Among the areas where Louisiana was recognized for full implementation, the report found:

- Science of reading training is required for all K-3 teachers
- Universal reading screener for K–3 students
- Parental notification of students identified with reading difficulties
- Elimination of three-cueing systems
- Individual reading plans for students identified as having a reading deficiency
- Monitoring students' progress within a multi-tiered system of support
- Targeting students' needs by adopting interventions grounded in the science of reading

I was intentional about calling out our state's literacy crisis early in my tenure and am pleased to see Louisiana leading the way with common sense reading reforms. With the support of our policy-makers, educators, and parents, Louisiana students will benefit from these bold efforts.

- Title I, Part A (TIA): Log into the portal and enter student counts in Table 1 under the TAS column or the Title I Schoolwide (SWP) column. Utilize the October 2022 student count in Table 1 to provide the Title I, Part A student participation counts.
  - Targeted Assistance Title I, Part A (TAS): Complete Tables 1-5 and those that are SWP will only complete Table 1.

## Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

#### **LEAP 2025 Spring Administration**

Please share with testing coordinators, special education staff, and school leaders.

All accommodations for LEAP 2025 spring testing must be finalized no later than March 15. The testing team will not review any requests for late accommodations. IEP teams should be aware that state testing accommodations should have been used routinely by students in classes well in advance of testing.

There is no accountability code to excuse students from testing for parental opt-outs. There is no formal process for opting students out, but the LDOE recommends that parents be required to submit a refusal of permission to test their child in writing to the principal in advance of the testing window. Schools cannot refuse to allow students to attend school on testing days, and should provide instructional activities for students.

The deadline to order accommodations and/or support materials for use in test window 1, and submitting ACT testing schedules is March 1. Please contact ACT Accommodations at 800 553 6244, ext. 1788.

The deadline to request qualified exceptions to the deadline for ACT-authorized accommodations and/or supports for eligible examinees in TAA using the Qualified Exceptions to the Deadline form is March 8.

Students who take the ACT using state accommodations that are not approved by ACT may be eligible for a score report that cannot be used for college reporting. While the results can be included in state accountability, parents should be aware that colleges and universities will not accept these reports, and they will not be made available from ACT for college reporting.

- Ready Start Networks Lead Agencies establish local advisory councils, develop strategic plans, and implement strategies focused on increasing access to high-quality early childhood care and education at the local level.
