- Schools will have **30 days** from the last day of quarterly enrollment reporting period (September 7) to report any enrollment issues using a Payment Adjustment Form.
- All Payment Adjustment Forms for Quarter 1 are due by <u>October 9</u>. Please note that late
 Payment Adjustment Form submissions are not guaranteed payment. Forms submitted after
 the deadline will be reviewed on case by case basis.

EdLink Security - Setting Up A New Account

Each fall, all nonpublic schools that are currently BESE approved must submit their school's annual enrollment data. Nonpublic school reporting managers will need to create an account with EdLink and request the *NPS School Manager role*. The detailed steps can be found in the <u>EdLink Manual</u>, which will guide each school through the steps to create an EdLink account. If support is needed, please email nonpublicschools@la.gov.

Nonpublic Schools Annual Enrollment Period

NPS annual enrollment opened on **September 6**. All nonpublic schools that are BESE approved (Nonpublic Seeking State Approval) must submit their annual enrollment data. Please refer to the <u>NPS EdLink Manual</u> to assist new users in getting an EdLink account setup in order to complete their school's annual reporting. The last day to submit your school's NPS annual enrollment is **October 15**.

Brumfield v. Dodd 2024-2025 Application

The 2024-2025 Brumfield v. Dodd's application will open on **September 1** for nonpublic schools located on our <u>Nonpublic Schools</u> webpage. Schools must complete the <u>Brumfield v. Dodd application</u> or <u>Brumfield v. Dodd Annual Compliance Report</u> and attach it to your BESE application, which will be submitted via Jotform again this year. The application will close on October 15.

2024-25 Notices of Intent for Scholarship Programs

The 2024-25 Notices of Intent for the Louisiana Scholarship Program and the School Choice Program for Students with Exceptionalities will be available on October 1. The link to the forms will be available via email, the scholarship website, and newsletter on that date.

The Notice of Intent is submitted to the Department each year in the fall by schools that wish to participate in the Louisiana Scholarship Programs and request *NEW* scholarship seats for the upcoming school year.

Schools must complete NOIs for each scholarship program even if no new seats are being requested for the upcoming year.

LEAN Practices School System Spots Still Available

Please share with principals, principal supervisors, and school system leaders,.

Louisiana, like the nation, faces challenges in recruitment and retention of effective, certified teachers and leaders. In Louisiana, 37% of teachers leave the profession in the first five years of teaching, and 17% of principals leave their role each year. In order for students to have successful outcomes, they need high quality teachers and leaders. Research demonstrates that work-related stress is one of the leading causes of teachers leaving the profession. The LDOE believes that investing in teachers by addressing their concerns is essential in driving school system improvement. School systems interested in taking part in a cohort created to directly address teachers' concerns should review the LEAN Practices Overview Document and complete the LEAN Practices Cohort Interest form by September 18. All selected participants will be notified no later than October 2. The first virtual collaborative meeting will be held October 10.
