EdLink Security - Setting Up A New Account

Each fall, all nonpublic schools that are currently BESE approved must submit their school's annual enrollment data. Nonpublic school reporting managers will need to create an account with EdLink and request the *NPS School Manager role*. The detailed steps can be found in the <u>EdLink Manual</u>, which will guide each school through the steps to create an EdLink account.

Nonpublic Schools Annual Enrollment Period

All nonpublic schools that are BESE approved (Nonpublic Seeking State Approval) must submit their annual enrollment data for 2023. Please refer to the NPS Gebooler Manager User Guide to assist all users in getting an EdLink account setup & be able to complete their school's annual reporting. The last day to submit your school's NPS annual enrollment is **October 15**. Do not create more than one MyLa account when setting up your Edlink account. This could cause a delay in your school being able to complete the enrollment report.

ACT MOU

Please share with school system leaders and testing coordinators.

All school systems that plan to administer the ACT in the state's spring testing window to students who are not eligible for testing under state contract must send a signed ACT MOU as soon as possible. They are now past due.

- Grade 11 students are eligible to test under state contract.
- Grade 12 students who do not have an ACT score from a prior administration are eligible to test under state contract.
- Grade 11 students on the Jump Start pathway who have never taken the Workkeys assessment are eligible to test one time under state contract.

U.S. Senate Youth Scholarship Program

Two Louisiana juniors or seniors will be chosen to attend the 62nd annual <u>U.S. Senate Youth Program</u> in Washington D.C. during the week of March 2-9, 2024. Upon completion of all on-site events, these two delegates will each receive a \$10,000 education scholarship. Juniors or seniors may qualify to apply through leadership positions they hold during the 2023-2024 school year per the <u>USSYP official criteria</u> for the current academic school year. All student leadership-qualifying positions are subject to the judgment of the state selection administrator and will be verified and confirmed. Students nominated by

their principals must submit an <u>application</u> of required USSYP official criteria information to the Louisiana Department of Education by Tuesday, October 3, 2023 at 11:59 p.m.

State finalists will be notified by Thursday, October 26, and delegates and alternates will be informed in mid-December of their selection.

FY 2023-2024 Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program Audit Please share with principals and financial officials

Pursuant to Section 1303 of Bulletin 133, State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education requires the Department to audit the financial performance and capacity of Scholarship schools as a criterion for continued participation in the Scholarship Program.

Scholarship Audit - Internal Control Questionnaire

Participating schools are required to complete the Internal Control Questionnaire. This information is provided to assist in evaluating that financial operations are effective and efficient and that schools have a reliable financial reporting system and comply with applicable laws and regulations. The completed questionnaire is due by Friday, October 20, 2023 via e-mail to staudit@la.gov.

Scholarship Audit Engagement Letters

Beginning Monday, October 9, 2023, the audit firms conducting the financial audits will begin contacting schools via an engagement letter. The letter will include audit dates and an in-depth description of the process and school responsibilities.

The audit firm assigned to your school is based on the <u>district</u> in which it is located. If your school has not been contacted by the assigned audit firm by October 13, or if you have any questions, please contact <u>staudit@la.gov</u>.

Parent Reporting and Individual Reading Improvement Plans

Please share with school and school system leaders.

As a reminder, schools are required to provide written notification to parents or legal custodians of students who are identified as having literacy skills that are below grade level based on the results of the statewide literacy screener. In addition, within thirty days of the student scoring below grade level, the parent/legal custodian shall receive an individual reading improvement plan that 1) describes the evidence-based reading intervention services the student will receive and 2) gives suggestions for strategies parents can use at home.
