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Message from the State Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

September is Attendance Awareness Month. Academic success starts with attendance and Louisiana is making progress. In 2022-23, our statewide truancy rate dropped by nearly 3% with over 24,000 fewer students identified as truant. This comes one year after Louisiana was a national outlier due to a dramatic decrease in chronic absenteeism.

Louisiana's child welfare and attendance professionals (CWAs) have been key to this progress. Our team at the LDOE continues to invest in CWAs. I encourage you to make sure the CWAs in your system are connected to our support.

- **Monthly calls:** Child welfare and attendance directors, supervisors, and attendance stakeholders in Louisiana meet every first Thursday of the month. Our next call is September 7 at 8 a.m.
- **Louisiana Attendance Planning Toolkit:** Louisiana CWAs create <u>toolkits</u> with resources, recordings, and tools to address chronic absence.
- Louisiana CWA web page: Our website now includes a <u>landing page of resources</u> for families and CWA professionals.
- **Annual summit:** Our CWA Summit is held each February in conjunction with the Jump Start Convention. This event brings together educators and experts from across the state.

Office of School Choice

DEADLINE IS TODAY: Quarterly Scholarship Enrollment

Quarter 1 reporting for the Louisiana Scholarship Program (SEE) and School Choice Program (SCS) must be submitted by <u>September 7</u> in order to receive tuition payments on-time.

- If any information is incorrect or a student is missing from your roster, please contact us immediately at studentscholarships@la.gov for assistance.
- If the enrollment reports are not accurate and submitted on time, it affects the student enrollment counts and delays tuition payments.
- Each school is responsible for reviewing the final quarterly enrollment report as entered in the LEADS system.
- If a student drops from your school, please follow the drop procedures so that the student can be dropped from your roster.

*Please note that the payment report generated in LEADS does not accurately reflect final payment amounts.

Schools will have **30 days** from the last day of quarterly enrollment reporting period each quarter to report any enrollment issues.

EdLink Security - Setting Up A New Account

Each fall, all nonpublic schools that are currently BESE approved must submit their school's annual enrollment data. Nonpublic school reporting managers will need to create an account with EdLink and request the *NPS School Manager role*. The detailed steps can be found in the <u>EdLink Manual</u>, which will guide each school through the steps to create an EdLink account. If support is needed, please email nonpublicschools@la.gov.

Nonpublic Schools Annual Enrollment Period

NPS annual enrollment opened on **September 6**. All nonpublic schools that are BESE approved (Nonpublic Seeking State Approval) must submit their annual enrollment data. Please refer to the NPS EdLink Manual to assist new users in getting an EdLink account setup in order to complete their school's annual reporting. The last day to submit your school's NPS annual enrollment is **October 15**.

Brumfield v. Dodd 2024-2025 Application

The 2024-2025 Brumfield v. Dodd's application will open on **September 1** for nonpublic schools located on our <u>Nonpublic Schools</u> webpage. Schools must complete the <u>Brumfield v. Dodd application</u> or <u>Brumfield v. Dodd Annual Compliance Report</u> and attach it to your BESE application, which will be submitted via Jotform again this year. The application will close on October 15.

The Notice of Intent is submitted to the Department each year in the fall by schools that wish to participate in the Louisiana Scholarship Programs and request *NEW* scholarship seats for the upcoming school year.

Schools must complete NOIs for each scholarship program even if no new seats are being requested for the upcoming year.

2023-2024 Title I, Part A Annual Comparability Reports

Please share with federal program directors and superintendents.

The LDOE will release the 2023-2024 SY Title I Comparability Report section in eGMS September 18. Title I Comparability requires school systems to demonstrate if services provided with state and local funds are comparable between Title I schools and non-Title I schools or are substantially comparable for school systems with all Title I schools. School systems with one school per grade span and Type 2, 3, 3B, and 5 charters are exempt from the submission.

School systems should use October 2022 staffing and salary data to complete this report. Access the

<u>Comparability Instructions</u> and the <u>Comparability FAQ</u> document for more details and instructions. The report must be submitted via eGMS no later than **November 17**.

U.S. Senate Youth Scholarship Opportunity

The LDOE, in partnership with the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, will select two juniors or seniors

to serve as delegates for the 62nd Annual Washington Week Program March 2-9, 2024. These two students will each receive a \$10,000 scholarship after attending all sessions scheduled for that week. Please refer to the LDOE's Awards webpage for more information.

- Any junior or senior holding an elected or appointed leadership position in the school, community, state, or nation may qualify to apply.
- The U.S. Youth Senate Scholarship application will trigger the release of the list of essay topics and directions for the proctored writing session from the state coordinator to the school sponsor. These topics are considered test secure by the Hearst Foundation and should be treated as such.
- The deadline for portfolio submission is October 3 at 11:59 p.m. Applications will not be returned. Finalists will be notified by October 26.
- The national exam and interviews will be held November 8 in Baton Rouge.
- Finalists will be notified by the LDOE in early December of their selections as delegates or alternates.
- The delegates must be able to attend all events in Washington, D.C. to receive the college scholarship.

Louisiana Organ Procurement Agency (LOPA) Education Program

Please share with school administrators, school system leaders, and teachers.

Act 180 of the 2023 Regular Legislative Session requires each public high school provide instruction relative to organ donation to students. The instruction shall be integrated into the curriculum of an existing required course, such as health education or another required course deemed appropriate by the public school governing authority.

The <u>LOPA</u> developed instruction modules designed to introduce students to the process of organ, tissue, and eye donation and transplantation. In addition to providing facts about donation for students to make informed decisions about joining the Louisiana Donor Registry, the program includes information on diseases and conditions that lead to organ failure, as well as the process used to match organs and

tissues to recipients. Education is provided by the LOPA Community Team (in-person or video) at no cost to schools.

School Safety Back-to-School Campaign

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), in partnership with the U.S. Departments of Education (ED), Health and Human Services (HHS), and the Department of Justice (DOJ), launched a <u>public</u> <u>awareness campaign</u> to highlight federal school safety resources and evidence-based practices available through <u>SchoolSafety.gov</u>.

The campaign will educate school administrators, teachers, parents and guardians, and state and local government officials about school safety resources available at SchoolSafety.gov. The goal is to advance the mission and maximize the benefits of the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) by accelerating and enhancing the implementation of programs and initiatives to help families, communities, and schools build capacity and establish and expand successful school safety strategies.
