BESE Endorses Resolutions Aimed at Strengthening Security on K-12 Campuses

In response to an increasing nationwide trend of shootings and other acts of violence in school facilities, the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) endorsed resolutions aimed at strengthening security in K-12 public schools.

At a special called meeting earlier this month, BESE officially requested that public school systems partner with local law enforcement to provide a school resource officer for all schools under their jurisdiction and further requested that the Louisiana Legislature provide adequate funding to school systems to ensure the implementation. The resolutions were adopted unanimously.

Louisiana Revised Statute 17:416.9 provides that any city, parish, local public school system, or nonpublic school may enter into agreements with local law enforcement agencies to provide for school resource officers. BESE's resolution would require officers to be certified by a nationally accredited school resource officer program or a state training program certified by the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training. BESE also requested that school systems annually report the total number of school resource officers to the Louisiana Department of Education.

LEAP 2025 Graduating Senior Retest

Students who are not eligible for graduation and are not grade 12 cannot participate in this option. Results for all other students will be reported no later than the close of the testing window.

2022-2023 Teacher Roster Verification

Please share with school system leaders, school leaders and educators.

The <u>Curriculum Verification and Results (CVR) Reporting Portal</u> roster verification ensures that teachers are assigned to the correct courses and classroom rosters of students for the purposes of value-added (VAM) analysis. The data in CVR will be used to calculate a teacher's VAM score even if the teacher and/or the principal do not verify the roster. Teachers of ELA, math, science, social studies (grades 4-8), Algebra I, geometry, English I and English II, and EOC courses are eligible to receive VAM scores and should verify their rosters.

- March 20 April 28: CVR Open for View-only. During this time, users can view and check roster data for accuracy but cannot make changes in the CVR Portal. The CVR Portal will be updated daily to reflect any submitted changes to EdLink 360.
- May 8 May 26: CVR Open for Roster Verification. Teachers and principals can verify and correct records for specific courses and students. Data managers will track verification completion at the school system and school levels.

<u>CIS Evaluation Closeout for Teachers, Counselors, and Librarians</u>

Please share with system leaders, school leaders, human resource directors, and data managers.

Systems may begin finalizing teacher, counselor, and librarian evaluations in May. Systems are encouraged to complete and sign off on all observation and Student Learning Target (SLT) data prior to staff leaving for summer break. Once the Compass Information System (CIS) rolls to SY 2023-2024 in the fall, no teacher, counselor, or librarian evaluation data for the 2022-2023 school year can be added or amended. It is recommended that educators complete the following assigned tasks.

Enter all SLTs in CIS Assess students and report SLT results in CIS Meet with evaluators to view and acknowledge observation and SLT scores

Note: Systems utilizing the spreadsheet to upload data to CIS should also finalize teacher, counselor, and librarian observations and SLTs in local system databases/trackers.

Literacy Licensure Test Standard-Setting Study Committee

Please share with literacy experts, including new teachers and mentor teachers.

In 2022, the state legislature passed ACT 214, which requires K - 3 teachers seeking initial licensure to pass a scientifically researched and evidence-based examination on the teaching of reading. This assessment will replace the existing Reading Language Arts exam, which is part of the Elementary Education: Multiple Subjects Praxis® exam.

The Louisiana Department of Education is seeking up to 18 committee members from K - 12 and educator preparation programs to serve on a two-day standard-setting study committee facilitated by Educational Testing Services. The <u>panel overview document</u> provides information on the standard-setting process and how to apply to the committee. The deadline to apply is **April 25**.
