LDH Health Alert Network

Please share with emergency operations staff and school system leaders.

The Louisiana Department of Health-Health Alert Network (LDH-HAN) is a unified method of sharing cleared information about urgent public health incidents with public information officers; federal, state, territorial, tribal, and local public health practitioners; clinicians; and public health laboratories. LDH collaborates with federal, state, city, and parish partners to develop protocols and stakeholder relationships that will ensure a robust interoperable platform for the rapid distribution of public health information. Alerts are disseminated to partners based on the levels of relevance.

Categories of Health Alert Network Messages

- Health Alert: Requires immediate action or attention; highest level of importance
- Health Advisory: May not require immediate action; provides important information for a specific incident or situation
- Health Update: Unlikely to require immediate action; provides updated information regarding an incident or situation
- HAN Info Service: Does not require immediate action; provides general public health information

<u>Teacher/Principal, New Teacher and Early Childhood Teacher/Leader of the Year</u> <u>Application Process Opening Soon</u>

On October 11, the Teacher/Principal, *New* Teacher, and the Early Childhood Teacher/Leader of the Year application process for the 2023-2024 school year will open. At this time, the application materials and timelines will be available in the <u>Library</u> on the <u>Awards</u> webpage.

All school systems are encouraged to select up to three teachers, three principals, and three *new* teachers (with less than one year of teaching experience), one per division (elementary, middle, and high) as their local-level honorees, and submit these selections to the state process. School systems without a formal selection process in place may elect to send their candidates directly to the state-level process.

State-level applications must be submitted via an online application portal, which will open in late 2023.

- Teacher/Principal of the Year and Early Childhood Teacher/Leader of the Year will be due January 11.
- New Teacher of the Year will be due January 26.
