Dear Colleagues,

The [school reopening dashboard](#) is now live on our website (it must be viewed in Google Chrome). This is the learning environment and connectivity tool we first emailed system leaders about in September. I previewed the dashboard in last week's Reopening Roundtable, the October BESE meeting and our most recent Superintendent's Advisory Council. This tool is for public and nonpublic systems to share information about student learning environments, devices and connectivity. If you haven't added your information yet, please do so as soon as possible.

This dashboard is a transparent way to share key reopening information with families, educators and anyone else with a stake in our schools. School has always looked different in Louisiana from parish to parish. That's especially true now as systems work to maintain high expectations for students during the pandemic. Our dashboard compiles foundational reopening information in one place.

The tool helps us identify where additional supports are needed in areas like student connectivity. It will provide critical data so the Department can advocate for resources to ensure all Louisiana students have the necessary technology to compete and succeed.

As school systems submit data, the dashboard automatically populates with the most current information. Even if you have already added information, I encourage you to update it regularly throughout the school year. Please don't hesitate to reach out to a member of our team if you have questions or concerns.

Deadline: School Plan Family Presentation Survey

Per state law, CIR and UIR schools must present families with their state-approved school improvement plan within 60 days of the start of the school year at a school meeting. The School Plan Family Presentation [template](#) was released in the spring and is located in the [School Improvement Library](#).

Schools are required to communicate the following to families in these meetings:

- School and student performance data that caused the Department to identify the school as being in need of improvement
- Detailed overview of the improvement plan
- Timelines for implementation of the plan and attainment of performance goals
- Implications of the plan for students, families, and educators

Families shall be notified at least one week prior to the date of the meeting. Meeting dates must be reported to the LDOE no later than **December 1** via the [School Plan Family Engagement Survey](#).

U. S. Presidential Scholar Program

The nomination process for the [U.S. Presidential Scholars Program](#) to honor our nation's most distinguished graduating high school seniors is now open. This is a joint program of the Department and the U.S. Department of Education.

The [U. S. Presidential Scholar program information guide](#) provides key details about the program and submission procedures. School systems may submit, for consideration, up to two students in the General Component and up to two students in the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Component. In order to recommend students for nomination to the program, school systems are required to submit to the LDOE a [parental release form](#) for each nominated student and a nomination letter for each nominated student not to exceed one page for each student.

Adobe Creative Cloud and Certiport Compass Testing

Please share with career and technical education supervisors.

School systems that utilize the Certiport Compass testing for on-premise deliveries of the live-in-the-app Adobe Certified Associate exams should be aware that Adobe traditionally releases new versions of Creative Cloud apps each year leading up to the Adobe MAX conference. Certiport has exams that support the 2018, 2019, and 2020 versions of the apps. Certiport will have exams that support the 2021 versions of the apps, but not until next year.

Systems using Compass for on-premise deliveries of the live-in-the-app Adobe Certified Associate exams will want to make sure Creative Cloud is not set to automatically update when the newest versions are released. There are options for individuals to turn off the auto-update feature, or systems can deploy a package that prevents individual users from seeing any update options at all. ACT

- Last week, the Department released ACT summaries to all school systems. A student-level roster has been placed on the FTP that provides school systems with the students who were included in the summaries.

- October 20 - Administer the makeup ACT for standard time testing.
- October 20-26 – Administer the makeup ACT for accommodations and/or supports.
- October 22 - Pre-scheduled FedEx pickup for standard time ACT materials at the district office.
 - *Note: Receipt deadline at ACT is **October 27**. Late arriving answer documents will not be scored.*
- October 28 - Pre-scheduled FedEx pickup for ACT materials from accommodations and/or supports at the district office.
 - *Note: Receipt deadline at ACT is **November 2**. Late arriving answer documents will not be scored.*
- **Important:** Test coordinators are reminded to only use ACT test materials sent for the October test. Answer documents from spring 2020 will be rejected if used in October, as well as any spring 2020 answer documents that are returned with barcode labels from October placed over the spring barcode labels.
- October 6-April 30: The 2020-2021 WorkKeys testing window is open.
 - Please refer to the *Quick Start Guide for Assigning TTS to a Single Examinee* for WorkKeys. The document will be posted to the ACT State Testing site in the [WorkKeys](#) section.
 - The Department will cover the cost for one WorkKeys administration for students who are on the Jump Start pathway and are in grade 11.

LEAP 2025 Assessment Development

- LDOE Assessment Development will convene LEAP 2025 Science Stimuli Review Committees in Lafayette for the following grades at the listed dates and times:
 - Grade 3: November 14 (9 a.m.-12:30 p.m.)
 - Grade 5: November 21 (9 a.m.-12:30 p.m.)
 - Grade 7: November 14 (1:30 p.m.-5 p.m.)
 - Grade 8: November 21 (1:30 p.m.-5 p.m.)
- The committees will review stimuli to ensure the materials that will be used to develop item and task sets on the LEAP 2025 Science tests are fair and appropriate for all students and will allow an opportunity for students to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in science. Participants may each earn a stipend and be reimbursed for mileage to and from the meeting.
- Interested science teachers (including those who work in special education or with English Learners), supervisors, and content specialists should complete the [interest survey](#) to apply to participate by **October 29**.

LEAP 2025 Enrollment Verification

- Now-October 31: School systems should log into DRC INSIGHT and complete the enrollment information for third and fourth grade that is required no later than **October 31**.
 - Schools testing third or fourth grade on paper should also indicate the number of test booklets needed.
 - School systems need to verify the number of braille tests necessary for testing grades 3-8 for both paper-based or computer-based testing formats.

NAEP 2021

- All schools selected for participation in the 2021 administration of NAEP have been notified by email from Rebecca Frederick.
- January 25 and March 19, 2021: Testing window has been extended 2 weeks to accommodate variation in school schedules.
- District test coordinators were copied on notifications and should help schools prepare for the assessment.
 - Review the *School Coordinator Responsibilities: A Guide to MyNAEP* that was emailed to all schools selected for NAEP.
 - Remind principals that they must designate a NAEP school coordinator to service as the liaison for all NAEP activities.
 - Encourage designated school coordinators to access the MyNAEP site (www.mynaep.com), and register with the ID number they received in the emailed notification.

 - [Act 688 Survey](#) - School systems are required to report the number of students referred for gifted screening based on their performance of the literacy screener, with the literacy screener being at least one indicator used in consideration for gifted screening. DTCs and Special Education Coordinators should work together to submit only one form per district. This data will be reported to BESE.
- The Department will work with those school systems that have been severely impacted by the recent hurricanes. The Department will review BESE policy to ensure alignment with state law and will consider flexibility in timelines for administration and reporting results during times of crisis or natural disaster. Career and College Readiness Reminders

Federal Policy on Military Recruiting in Schools

Please share with principals and counselors to ensure systems are in compliance with federal law.

Representatives of military recruiting offices have recently contacted the Department to express concerns regarding access to student contact information. By federal law according to 20 U.S.C. 7908, all school systems that receive funds under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) must provide student's names, addresses, and telephone listings to military recruiters unless the student's parents or guardians have individually opted out of providing this information. Local education authorities cannot adopt a blanket opt-out policy and 20 U.S.C. 7908 supersedes any conflicting state law.

In addition, please be mindful that schools are to allow recruiters from the various branches of service equitable access to classrooms and/or facilities. School systems must allow equal access and accommodation to all branches of services in accordance with a consistent application of their local policies. Students interested in joining the military after high school should be allowed to receive information from all branches of service so they can make an intelligent decision if they are considering joining the military.

Assessment and Accountability Reminders

2020 List of Schools in Need of Intervention Now Available

Due to the impact of COVID-19 on school closures, school performance scores and letter grades were not produced for the 2019-2020 school year. On March 20, the U.S. Department of Education (ED) approved a waiver request by the Louisiana Department of Education, waiving most assessment and accountability requirements for the 2019-2020 school year. As part of that waiver, ED required the Department to maintain the existing list of schools in need of intervention from the 2019 release. As such, schools have not exited or entered intervention status from the 2019 release based on the 2019-2020 school year, and the 2020 intervention list uses 2018-2019 school year data as the most recent year of data.
