Superintendent's Message

Dear Colleagues,

"An investment in knowledge pays the best interest." - Benjamin Franklin

In recent weeks, the subject of money has consumed Baton Rouge, where there remains a wide hole in the state budget. Students who have earned TOPS scholarships are stuck again with an [uncertain fate](#). [Child care cuts](#) from years past have not been restored. Louisiana's teachers are struggling with [stagnant wages](#). But there remain serious [disagreements](#) as to how all of this is going to get solved.

It seems we are struggling to remember Ben Franklin's guidance. Whatever one's politics, money is central to our work to improve Louisiana's schools, and, like it or not, our mission necessitates that there be ample resources and that they be used well.

Next week, BESE will vote on the MFP formula. The formula will then be sent to the Legislature, where it will be factored into a larger debate over the 2019 budget. Legislators can accept the formula, reject the formula, or send it back to BESE during the session with suggested changes. You will receive a copy by email of the formula BESE will consider this Friday, along with initial financial projections for next school year.

In the coming months, you will also see improvements in the manner in which our state administers federal education dollars. Many of these changes are part of the implementation of ESSA, which will come into full effect in the 2018-19 school year. Other improvements will more closely align applications for federal funding with district plans and school improvement initiatives. All of these improvements intend to provide districts with better opportunities to integrate federal resources into a districtwide vision of achievement and support for all students.

This is a [snapshot](#) of some of the more significant changes and the points at which we will be engaging with members of your teams to ensure they understand these changes and provide resources and assistance. In addition, I will be speaking about these shifts with your federal programs directors at the spring conference of the Louisiana Association of School Administrators of Federally Assisted Programs (LASAFAP).

While there is much work ahead, this is also an exciting moment for the ESSA plan we collectively created as a state, and I look forward to working in partnership with you as our plan comes to fruition.

Charter Monitoring

Reminder: Updated Transportation FAQ and Transportation Plans for Type 2 Charter Schools

Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, BESE policy requires all state-authorized charter schools to provide transportation to and from school for all students living in the parish in which the school is located and who live more than 1 mile from the school.

The Office of Portfolio has created an updated [Transportation FAQ](#) document for all state-authorized charter schools to ensure that school leaders and boards have their questions answered and are informed of the specific responsibilities of providing transportation. This document will also assist schools that need to complete the RFP process for transportation providers for the 2018-19 school year.

Beginning with 2016 graduates, submission of the "Documentation For A Certificate of Achievement" form is not required due to Louisiana's student privacy law (R.S. 17:3914) that provides for limitations and prohibitions on the collection and sharing of student information. School Systems will continue ensuring that students exiting with a Certification of Achievement are indicated in the Special Education Reporting (SER) System and Student Information System (SIS).

Please use the [Diploma Order Form](#) to request Certificates of Achievement. Only one order form should be submitted for each school system. Lab schools, Type 2 and Type 5 charter schools, special schools and non-public schools should also submit a diploma order form for certificate of achievement.

New: 2017-2018 Educator Workforce Data

New: Updating/Adding Users to the Superintendent and Principal Secure Reporting System

Districts have requested access rights for additional district and school staff within the secure reporting system. The Division of Administration Office of Technology Services (OTS) has not yet completed the work needed to allow school systems to assign permissions to different user groups within the secure reporting system. The Department has identified an interim solution to assist school systems with setting up the appropriate staff while OTS continues to build a permanent solution.

The Department has created a file of secure portal users for superintendent/security coordinator review that, once finalized, the Department will use to perform a mass update on behalf of the school system. This file for review has been placed on the data management FTP site and is named (LEA Code)_(LEA Name)_SecurePortalUserList.xlsx. Local data management FTP coordinators should retrieve the file and provide to superintendents and security coordinators. Directions on how to complete the work are included in the file.

New: February 2018 Data File of Economically Disadvantaged Students

The Department will release the February 2018 data file of economically disadvantaged students for each school system the week of March 12. The single Excel file, LEACode_LEA Name_Feb 2018 Economically Disadvantaged.xlsx, will be available through June 30, on the Data Management FTP site. FTP coordinators should locate their individual school system file and share it with their federal program and finance staff.

The data include students eligible for SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, and those who are limited English proficient (LEP), homeless, migrant, foster care, incarcerated, or receive reduced priced lunch (for non-CEP LEAs only). These data will be used by the Department to inform grants, federal funding, and subgroup determinations.

Reminder: New Student-Centered Funding Pilot Program

U.S Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos announced a pilot program that will grant school districts new flexibility to create equitable, student-centered funding systems. With this flexibility, school districts can combine eligible federal funds with state and local funds to create a single, student-centered funding system based on weights for students from low-income families, English learners, and other educationally disadvantaged student groups.

The Department can approve up to 50 school districts to participate in this pilot program authorized by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The official application opened February 7, 2018. For applicants intending to use the flexibility during the 2018-2019 school year, the application is due by March 12, 2018. For applicants intending to use the flexibility during the 2019-2020 school year, the application is due by July 15, 2018.
