Superintendent's Message

Dear Colleagues,

BESE wrapped up two days of meetings earlier this week. While there were no policy issues discussed that made for big newspaper headlines, the board took important steps toward policy changes that will be the subject of conversation in weeks and months to come.

The board heard a report from an alternative education working group, for example, endorsing a plan to define more specifically the term "alternative school" in policy, so that the board can create a unique accountability system for such schools later this fall. The board also endorsed the idea of such a rating system for schools that serve students with cognitive disabilities residing in residential facilities. Both policies will be discussed at next week's Superintendents Advisory Council (SAC).

BESE also considered a report from the most recent SAC meeting and endorsed the creation of a system of testing compliance that requires fewer local investigations of administrative errors, that allows for results of such investigations to be presented to an external board, and that seeks independent investigation when large-scale irregularities are detected. The Department will begin developing a proposed policy in response.

As you may have read, the Department [responded](#) this week to an [independent report](#) evaluating the Special School District. The initial response includes re-envisioning the role of superintendent and launching a [national search](#) for a leader in this new capacity.

And finally, BESE reviewed five years of [Jump Start progress](#), specifically focusing on the types of industry-based credentials students pursuing Jump Start are earning. The board requested an independent analysis of the alignment of those credentials with statewide workforce needs; that report will be presented to the board in June.

These are likely not surprising steps, but they are each important. I look forward to discussing them with you, starting next week at the SAC meeting.

Reminder: Updated Transportation FAQ and Transportation Plans for Type 2 Charter Schools

Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, BESE policy requires all state-authorized charter schools to provide transportation to and from school for all students living in the parish in which the school is located and who live more than 1 mile from the school.

The Office of Portfolio has created an updated [Transportation FAQ](#) document for all state-authorized charter schools to ensure that school leaders and boards have their questions answered and are informed of the specific responsibilities of providing transportation. This document will also assist schools that need to complete the RFP process for transportation providers for the 2018-19 school year.

New: Update: ACT Match/No Match Lists

ACT Match/No Match lists have been updated and posted to the FTP. The updated rosters include additional scores for students who tested in a prior year and provide school systems with information for students who transferred to them since November.

- All students enrolled in grade 12 are expected to have an ACT score unless they participated in alternate assessment.
- Students who are listed on the ACT Match list have an ACT score on record with the Department and can be retested at the expense of the school system.
- Students who are listed on the No Match list do not have an ACT score. They should be tested in March unless they participate in alternate assessment.
- School systems should not send any change or update requests at this time. ACT data certification will be conducted in August prior to release of school performance scores.

The Department and Johns Hopkins University launched today the Louisiana High School Redesign Cohort. This Cohort will include approximately 25 high schools-alternative and traditional-that will work together to re-think the core components of high school design. The redesign cohort is an opportunity for high schools to collaborate with their peers and national experts on how to prepare students for the 21st century. This cohort will reimagine both high school structures and services to maximize positive student outcomes, and better prepare students for post-secondary and careers.

Data

Reminder: Updating/Adding Users to the Superintendent and Principal Secure Reporting System

School systems have requested access rights for additional school system and school staff within the secure reporting system. The Division of Administration Office of Technology Services (OTS) has not yet completed the work needed to allow school systems to assign permissions to different user groups within the secure reporting system. The Department has identified an interim solution to assist school systems with setting up the appropriate staff while OTS continues to build a permanent solution.

The Department has created a file of secure portal users for superintendent/security coordinator review that, once finalized, will be used to perform an update. This file has been placed on the FTP and is named (LEA Code)_(LEA Name)_SecurePortalUserList.xlsx. Data management FTP coordinators should retrieve the file and provide to superintendents and security coordinators. Directions on how to complete the work are included in the file.

Once the work is completed, save the file with "_ Completed" at the end of the name (ex: 001_Acadia_SecurePortalUserList_ Completed.xlsx) and have your data management FTP coordinator upload the file in the same location as the original. Superintendents will also need to send an email to systemsupport@la.gov confirming the filename that has been uploaded and providing his/her consent for the Department to add the users contained in that file (e.g. "I have reviewed the file named 001_Acadia_SecurePortalUserList_ Completed.xlsx and give consent to the Department to provide those users access to the secure portal.").
