## Superintendent's Message

Dear Colleagues,

In 2012, the Legislature created [Act 3](#), a visionary step toward unifying the state's fragmented early childhood system. For the last six years, you have worked side-by-side with Head Start providers, child care centers, and nonpublic schools to implement standards of excellence, a shared observation system, and cooperative enrollment systems for families. As a result, more parents have enrolled in early education programs, and programs are seeing significant improvement in the quality of classroom care and teaching.

There remain large gaps in the system, however. As is often noted, slots are available to too few parents. Equally important, options performing at a high level are even less available. Parents of infants and toddlers have particularly low levels of access to high-performing centers.

[Act 639](#) of this year's regular legislative session builds on Act 3 in two ways. First, it creates a statewide task force, set to meet for the first time [today](#), which will study the state's early education progress, making recommendations for further growth this winter. Next, it creates pilots that provide opportunities for local entities to lead local networks not just in implementing CLASS I; or running enrollment processes, but also in supporting centers to improve. These pilots could serve as evidence that local leaders are well positioned to lead a quality agenda in their communities. When the request for applications for local pilots is released, I hope your parish or community will consider applying. I also hope you will monitor the task force and its recommendations.

Fortunately, the federal government recently made one-time funds available for child care access. Consequently, later this week, the Department will announce a radical reduction in the waitlist. This is great news.

But it is a one-time occurrence, and the reality underneath this ray of hope is that we still cannot provide an assurance to low-income families that a high-quality option will always be available to them. I'm looking forward to all the good that can come of Act 639, in the hopes of even better news to come for the state's youngest children and their parents.

## **New: Action Items and Important Information for District Testing Coordinators**

### **General**

- Data certification for ACT and DCAI will begin in early August. It is very important that all changes to district test coordinators (DTCs) or accountability contacts be submitted to the Department using the [DTC and Accountability Contact Update](#) form found in the Assessment Library.
- The State Placement Test Administrator Manual is posted in [eDIRECT](#). Test setup and the additional materials window opens this Friday, August 3.
- Spanish, Arabic, and Vietnamese versions of the English Learner Checklist have been posted to the [Assessment Library](#).

### **K-3**

- School systems should prepare to administer the kindergarten-readiness screener and a K-3 literacy screener within the first 30 days of school, and will submit the data with the SIS October 1 MFP Collection.
- The [2018-2019 Guidance on the Kindergarten Entry Assessment and K-3 Literacy Screening Assessment](#) has been released.

### **LEAP 360**

- LEAP 360 Diagnostic Teacher Study Guides are now available in [eDIRECT](#), including answer keys, scoring guides, and copies of the assessments. Teacher Study Guides can be found in General Information under Documents; select the Diagnostic/Interim 18-19 administration and the Teacher Study Guides document type.

**New: Distribution of 2018-2019 CDF Funds Distributed in July**

### **Please share with finance personnel.**

Based on requests from school systems, 75 percent of Career Development Funds (CDF) were distributed in the July 2018 MFP remittance. CDF was distributed based on whichever of the following allocations was greater:

- a) the minimum CDF allocation (\$25,000 for districts, \$10,000 for charter schools); or
- b) 75 percent of a school system's prior year's CDF allocation.

This early distribution of CDF enables school systems and schools to invest these funds immediately, maximizing student opportunities in the 2018-2019 school year. The balance of CDF will be distributed in February 2019 based on actual student enrollments.
