## Superintendent's Message

Dear Colleagues,

This week, the MFP Task Force, annually convened by BESE, met for the first time this year. Per usual, the task force will review investments that state and local taxpayers make in elementary and secondary schools. The first meeting was largely a review of the last year and the last decade.

As has unfortunately become customary, the agenda showed very modest increases to public education funding over the last decade, even as retirement obligations increase. However, in a break with recent years, this year's task force will be conducted in an environment in which increased investment appears to be top of mind for policy makers around the state. Already the Governor and legislative leaders have, for example, voiced their support for increased compensation for teachers and other employees.

It seems reasonable to expect that the task force will ultimately advocate for increased investment in the MFP. At the same time, there will undoubtedly be discussion - perhaps even debate - as to the mechanics of how that increase should be implemented. What should be the relationship, for example, between a funding increase and employee compensation? What should the relationship be between locally funded pay increases and state funded pay increases? Are there factors other than the cost of personnel that should be factored into a new formula? These questions and others will surely arise as the task force proceeds with its charge.

Over the course of the time between now and March, when BESE considers a new MFP formula, these issues and others will be considered in great detail. The legislative session will present further opportunity for deliberation. The Department will keep you updated on that dialogue as it unfolds, and I hope that you are able to participate actively, at the task force, at the Superintendents Advisory Council, and at BESE. I hope as well that the education community will rally around a unified proposal that benefits teachers, students, and our great state alike.

## **Reminder: Request for Nominations for the 2019 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program**

The nomination process for the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program is now open. Each state can nominate up to 25 students for one of the following [categories](#):

- General: outstanding academic performance on the ACT or SAT

The Department invites school systems to submit nominations for up to three outstanding students. The nominations must include a male and female student for the general category, and at least one nomination should be for a student who has been successful in career and technical education. School systems or schools are required to expend the weighted student funds on personnel, professional services, instructional materials, equipment, and supplies that serve the unique needs of students who generate such funds.
