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Message from the State Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

September is Attendance Awareness Month. Academic success starts with attendance and Louisiana is making progress. In 2022-23, our statewide truancy rate dropped by nearly 3% with over 24,000 fewer students identified as truant. This comes one year after Louisiana was a national outlier due to a dramatic decrease in chronic absenteeism.

Louisiana's child welfare and attendance professionals (CWAs) have been key to this progress. Our team at the LDOE continues to invest in CWAs. I encourage you to make sure the CWAs in your system are connected to our support.

- **Monthly calls:** Child welfare and attendance directors, supervisors, and attendance stakeholders in Louisiana meet every first Thursday of the month. Our next call is <u>September 7 at 8 a.m.</u>
- Louisiana Attendance Planning Toolkit: Louisiana CWAs create <u>toolkits</u> with resources, recordings, and tools to address chronic absence.
- Louisiana CWA web page: Our website now includes a landing page of resources for families and CWA professionals.
- **Annual summit:** Our CWA Summit is held each February in conjunction with the Jump Start Convention. This event brings together educators and experts from across the state.

2023-2024 Title I, Part A Annual Comparability Reports

Please share with federal program directors and superintendents.

The LDOE will release the 2023-2024 SY Title I Comparability Report section in eGMS September 18. Title I Comparability requires school systems to demonstrate if services provided with state and local funds are comparable between Title I schools and non-Title I schools or are substantially comparable for school systems with all Title I schools. School systems with one school per grade span and Type 2, 3, 3B, and 5 charters are exempt from the submission.

School systems should use October 2022 staffing and salary data to complete this report. Access the <u>Comparability Instructions</u> and the <u>Comparability FAQ</u> document for more details and instructions. The report must be submitted via eGMS no later than **November 17**.

U.S. Senate Youth Scholarship Opportunity

The LDOE, in partnership with the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, will select two juniors or seniors to serve as delegates for the 62nd Annual Washington Week Program March 2-9, 2024. These two students will each receive a \$10,000 scholarship after attending all sessions scheduled for that week. Please refer to the LDOE's Awards webpage for more information.

- The <u>U.S. Youth Senate Scholarship application</u> will trigger the release of the list of essay topics and directions for the proctored writing session from the state coordinator to the school sponsor. These topics are considered test secure by the Hearst Foundation and should be treated as such.
- The deadline for portfolio submission is **October 3** at 11:59 p.m. Applications will not be returned. Finalists will be notified by October 26.
- The national exam and interviews will be held November 8 in Baton Rouge.
- Finalists will be notified by the LDOE in early December of their selections as delegates or alternates.
- The delegates must be able to attend all events in Washington, D.C. to receive the college scholarship.

In addition to providing facts about donation for students to make informed decisions about joining the Louisiana Donor Registry, the program includes information on diseases and conditions that lead to organ failure, as well as the process used to match organs and tissues to recipients. Education is provided by the LOPA Community Team (in-person or video) at no cost to schools.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), in partnership with the U.S. Departments of Education (ED), Health and Human Services (HHS), and the Department of Justice (DOJ), launched a <u>public awareness campaign</u> to highlight federal school safety resources and evidence-based practices available through <u>SchoolSafety.gov</u>.
