Ready to Achieve Operational Guidelines Masking and Transportation Update

Please share with system leaders, site administrators and school nurses.

The Louisiana Department of Health and the CDC released COVID-19 community levels to help communities and individuals make masking decisions based on their local context.

- Universal masking is recommended for any school in a parish with a high community level.
- Schools may continue to require universal masking regardless of community level.
- Individuals attending schools that do not require masking may choose to mask regardless of community level.
- School buses are no longer included in the federal mask requirement for transit.
- Schools should use community levels to determine their policy for wearing masks on school buses but can continue to require universal masking regardless of community level.

[Community levels](#) should be checked weekly to evaluate the need for masking in school systems.

SPED Fellow Academy: Cohort Three

[SPED Fellow Academy](#) is a yearlong, comprehensive development program for novice special education leaders (administrators) across Louisiana. The program will provide in-person training, coaching, and a community of practice that will instill the knowledge and skills the next generation of leaders needs to lead and sustain change to improve outcomes for students with disabilities. Learning will cover topics such as strategic budgeting, stakeholder engagement, laws and policies, leveraging data, leadership development including managing teams and sustaining change. In addition to a robust curriculum, the program will support fellows in examining a systems level problem of practice, developing a theory of action to address the problem of practice, and developing an action plan to lead systems level change.

We encourage full-time administrators who are managing across these areas to [apply](#) between April 11 and May 13. To improve our special education leadership pipeline, this year applications will be open to SPED coordinators who plan to be school system special education leaders in the next 3-5 years. Please note that a recommendation letter from the SPED coordinator's current special education supervisor will be required.

Mentor Teacher Funding Increase for 2021-2022

Please share with system leaders who support mentors.

The Department has determined that mentors supporting **year-long undergraduate residents** in the 2021-2022 school year will receive a \$1,800 stipend instead of the usual \$1,000 stipend. These funds will be added to school system allocations in eGMS. School systems should have received an email with details regarding the mentor allocations the week of March 7.

This additional funding is for **one year only**, based on availability of funds.

Post- Baccalaureate Mentors

Policy requires that alternate certification candidates in their first year on a Practitioner's License (PL) be mentored for five hours per week. School systems will verify this mentoring through an attestation form that is part of a candidate's application for a Level 1 certificate or renewal of a Practitioner License. Candidates without the mentoring will be unable to renew the PL or advance to the Level 1 certificate.

CIS End-of-Year Closeout for Teacher Evaluations

Please share with school leaders.

The Department has issued a [CIS Timeline](#) to guide all school systems through the evaluation process deadlines for the 2021-2022 school year. To create a streamlined teacher evaluation upload process at the end of the year, it is recommended that all sites complete the following tasks in [CIS](#).

- Update rosters to reflect only 2021-2022 educators.
- Assign evaluators and correct evaluation types for each educator.
- Assign SLTs to each educator.

The Compass Information System (CIS) will shut down for the 2021-2022 school year on **September 1, 2022**. Following this date, no teacher evaluation data for the 2021-2022 school year will be able to be amended or added. Please prepare to complete the following no later than **August 26, 2022** in [CIS](#).

- Rate both SLTs for teachers and staff.
- Enter professional practice scores for teachers and staff. (Reminder: any teacher scoring a 2.5 or above is only required to have one professional practice score for the 2021-2022 school year only. This will be entered two times to ensure the CIS average is correct. Further guidance for uploads will be forthcoming.)
- Once data is uploaded, finalize teacher evaluations.

2021-2022 ESSA and IDEA Monitoring Rubrics Released

Please share this announcement with school system leaders, federal program directors, and special education coordinators.

The Department will continue to implement a risk-based monitoring selection process for federal program monitoring. The ESSA monitoring rubric will be made available to every school system assigned a letter grade. Additionally, the IDEA monitoring rubric will be made available to every school system assigned an LEA Determination. In most circumstances, school systems will receive two monitoring rubrics, ESSA and IDEA.

The monitoring rubrics, also known as a monitoring report card, provide a detailed preview of compliance factors and performance data analyzed to determine the most appropriate monitoring experience for school systems. Monitoring rubrics will be available for download via FTP March 11 and will be accessible until April 15. The Department reserves the right to make adjustments to monitoring rankings based on factors which may not be included on the rubric. For any school system selected to participate in program monitoring, a formal monitoring notification from an assigned Department monitoring team leader will follow.

Louisiana Comeback Plan

The Department called on school systems across the state to join the Louisiana Comeback, a cooperative campaign to accelerate student learning and ignite academic recovery.

This year, school systems made significant investment in three key areas:

1. Attendance and well-being
2. Recovery and acceleration
3. Professional learning

The Department anticipates celebrating our schools who have made a comeback, with student academic achievement. This year, we will reward “Comeback Campuses” to schools who achieve the following:

Elementary/Middle Schools

In 2022, achieved or exceeded percent proficient rates of 2019 without increasing the percent of unsatisfactory rates from 2019.

High Schools

In 2022, achieved or exceeded perfect proficient rates of 2019 without increasing the perfect of unsatisfactory rates from 2019, **and** achieved or exceeded their ACT average score of 2019.
