2023-2024 Seal of Biliteracy Orders

Since the approval of RS 17:273.4 in 2024, Louisiana students may earn the State Seal of Biliteracy by demonstrating literacy in English and another language. Please use the <u>Diploma and Seal Order Form</u> to submit an order for the 2023-2024 graduates. The order form is open and ready for orders to be placed. Along with the Diploma and Seal order form, school systems should submit the <u>Seals of Biliteracy</u> <u>Request Document</u>.

All diploma and seal requests must be submitted through the electronic form. The deadline to submit orders is February 2, 2024. Only one form should be completed for each school system. The Department will cover the costs for the initial order and distribution request that are received by the due date.

High schools with at least 5% of their graduating class earning the Seal of Biliteracy will be celebrated at the June BESE meeting.

Annual Teacher Exit Survey Released

The annual <u>Teacher Exit Survey</u> highlights the progress of Louisiana's comprehensive recruitment and retention strategy. This past year saw the following improvement:

- For the first time in four years, there was an increase in the total teacher workforce.
- The rate of exiting teachers decreased by one percentage point from 14 to 13 percent.
- The top three reasons for teachers exiting their current position remained the same: personal reasons, transferring to another Louisiana school system, and retirement.
