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PRINCIPAL CORNER



Louisiana is on the move! For two years in a row, Louisiana has shown an academic rise and continues to show consistent progress for schools across the state. That's the momentum we need to take teaching and learning to the next level.

Calling all instructional leaders! Are you ready to take a stand and bring education to the next level ... one school, one teacher, and one student at a time? It is our time to shake things up and become the innovative, creative, problem solvers that we are. The role of a principal is multifaceted, and we are the CEOs of the most important corporation in the country, "School." Similarly to most corporations, we have committed, driven, and intentional staff who will do whatever it takes to protect our investment – our students – and ensure that we get a return

on our investment, the results. In addition, corporations are often competitive and strive to be leaders of their craft or expertise. Likewise, we use data to inform our next steps in making decisions about how to advance closer to our goals.

For the school year, let's vow to change the game and be intentional about moving from good to great. In a world of players, be a game changer. We got GAMES (**G**oals **A**nd **M**otivation **E**qual **S**uccess). A game-changer is an individual or company that significantly alters the way things are done. Game-changing individuals often use their personality traits and attitudes to spark change. I'm sure there are many ways one can be a game changer.

Here is how my faculty and staff intend to be **game changers** at my school.

 Gather your leadership team often to develop goals for both students and staff and make decisions to improve teaching and learning.

- Assign mentors and mentees strategically. Think about personalities, expertise, and time availability. Consider mentor and mentee pairs who are not in the same grade level.
- Mentor your diversified leadership team. Do walkthroughs together and ask reflective questions.
 Model the coaching and feedback cycle with them. Give opportunities to lead, and aim to develop your team to be your master teachers, resulting in having a master teacher in every hall.
- Engage your community supporters. Create a consortium of community organizations to help you leverage resources to take your school further. Create a community council that keeps you in tune with the community's needs.
- Cheer for your school daily, all the time. Exude confidence and speak positive affirmations. Send short encouraging messages to your staff daily and share them with the students.
- Have fun on purpose. Participate in the different events and be visible. Attend skate night and skate. Attend school dances and dance. Cheer and excite students during the pep rallies. Play the games during the school fair and eat the snowball during the snowball sale.
- Address issues quickly and refocus behaviors to align with your non-negotiables and expectations. Then inspect what you expect.
- **N**urture your staff. Show that you are interested in them. Meet with your teachers to discuss progress and for a wellness check. Meet with your students to set goals. Schedule *Coffee and Conversations* with your parents to get to know them. Be sure to have a focus for each session.
- Go first. Be a risk taker on behalf of the greater good and in pursuit of a return for your investment.
- Energize the staff and your mind with a growth mindset. Growth-minded people learn from failures and embrace challenges. They desire to learn, look at the bigger picture, and seek solutions.
- Reflect and reset every day with the intent to have a better day than the day before.

My colleagues, in a world full of players, be a Game Changer. Let's change the game in our beloved Louisiana and level up to new heights. I know that the best is yet to come and that our future will be greater than the past.

Welcome back to school! This new year brings new social studies standards and curriculum for K-12 teachers and students. To assist teachers in the transition to the new standards, the Department has created a few resources.

Social Studies Course Frameworks provide pacing guidance, suggested questions, and primary and secondary sources and support to teachers in planning high-quality aligned lessons using the 2022 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies. The frameworks are being updated regularly based on feedback from the field. It is essential that teachers utilize the latest version of the Social Studies Frameworks.

Social Studies <u>Instructional Strategy Bank</u> offers guidance and protocols for whole-group instruction. These strategies can assist teachers in implementing best practices in social studies classrooms.

Bayou Bridges

The Department, in partnership with Core Knowledge, is creating Bayou Bridges, a new K-8 social studies curriculum. Teachers and administrators can visit the <u>Bayou Bridges resource page</u> for more information.

Throughout the fall, the Department will be hosting <u>office hours</u> to answer questions, receive feedback, and generally support teachers using the Bayou Bridge curriculum. These sessions will provide teachers with the opportunity to

- ask questions and provide feedback about particular lessons or strategies;
- get help locating materials; and
- ask questions about timelines.

School system staff office hours are 11 a.m - 12 p.m.; teacher office hours are 3:30 - 4 p.m.

On-demand training <u>modules</u> are now available for Bayou Bridges for grades 4 and5. In these modules, teachers are introduced to Bayou Bridges components and design, as well as a unit study tool designed to help them get started. It is recommended that administrators follow up with teachers to ensure that they have completed the modules. A certificate is provided to teachers upon completion of the course.

A detailed Bayou Bridges unit release <u>schedule</u> is also now available, providing districts, administrators, and teachers with precise release dates for each unit in grades K - 8.

We hope that these new resources help both teachers and school leaders as they work to bring our new social studies standards to life. Thank you so much for all that you do.

All non-VAM teacher, counselor, and librarian evaluations should be finalized. The 2022-2023 VAM data will be released into CIS on **October 6**. All VAM teacher evaluations should be finalized following this date. The final deadline to enter or <u>upload</u> 2022-2023 evaluation data is **October 27**. Data cannot be entered or edited after the system closes for the 2022-2023 school year.

The <u>Compass Information System (CIS)</u> will be open for the 2023-2024 school year on **November 3**. Following this date, teachers and evaluators may begin entering SLT and observation data for the current year. Please contact <u>compass@la.gov</u> with questions.

Zearn Checkpoint

Now is the time to set expectations and check data for <u>Zearn Implementation</u> in the classroom. Teachers should reflect on the key factors of planning, behavior management, engagement, and goal setting through the use of the class reports.

Teachers should consider the following:

- Are teachers and students signing in to Zearn regularly?
- Are students getting 90 minutes per week with Zearn?
- Are students completing three grade-level Zearn lessons per week?

<u>Updates with inquiryHub Biology</u>

The developers of <u>inquiryHub Biology</u> (<u>iHub</u>), one of Louisiana's identified <u>high-quality pilots in science</u>, have partnered with OpenSciEd to build on their previous work and develop new instructional resources for biology, chemistry, and physics. Full courses will be published on a rolling basis on the <u>OpenSciEd's website</u>. The current iHub materials and <u>Louisiana Guide to Piloting iHub Biology</u> will remain available; however, all curricular updates and professional learning will shift to the OpenSciEd versions of the materials.

 These topics are considered test secure by the Hearst Foundation and should be treated as such.
- The deadline for portfolio submission is **October 3** at 11:59 p.m. Applications will not be returned. Finalists will be notified by October 26.
- The national exam and interviews will be held November 8 in Baton Rouge.
- Finalists will be notified by the LDOE in early December of their selections as delegates or alternates.
- The delegates must be able to attend all events in Washington, D.C. to receive the college scholarship.
