Aspiring Principal Fellowship 2024-2025 Application Available

The Louisiana Department of Education is expanding the Aspiring Principal Fellowship (APF) for the 2024-2025 school year. APF cohort participants will meet throughout the year to explore best practices with regional experts, participate in school visits, and reflect on leadership practices. Participants will exit this fellowship with a robust leadership portfolio, the guidance of Louisiana's most successful principals, and a strong network of lifelong colleagues.

Applicants must hold a current EDL1 certification in Louisiana. School systems are responsible for covering the cost of the \$1,000 tuition for presenters and materials, as well as travel costs. Interested candidates should

complete the <u>Aspiring Principal Fellowship Application</u> by **March 8**. Fellowship applicants will be notified of acceptance by March 28.
