My name is Casey Hendricks, and I currently serve as the 6-12 social studies curriculum specialist for the St. Tammany Parish School Board. This is my 24th year as a social studies educator and my second year as a <u>Teacher Leader Advisor (TLA)</u>.

This year, my fellow TLAs and I have been working to update the social studies course frameworks aligned to the 2022 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies (LSSSS). Together, we have prioritized updating these resources to better support teachers as they implement the 2022 LSSSS. This additional support will help teachers make instructional decisions centered around the students' instructional needs.

My part of this project has been focused on the updates to the high school Civics course framework. Newly written document-based questions prompt students to dissect primary sources, including constitutional texts and political speeches, thus fostering a multifaceted understanding of the

development of the United States government and civic principles. I am excited to see how these new resources will help students apply social studies content knowledge to make and express claims based on evidence.

<u>Teacher Leader Summit</u> is just around the corner, and I hope to see you there! A series of social studies sessions will focus on supporting teachers implementing the <u>Bayou Bridges: A K-8 Louisiana Social Studies Curriculum</u> and will support teachers with internalizing lessons, pacing, and backward planning. Additionally, a session will be devoted to the implementation of the new resources added to the Civics course framework. Teacher Leader Summit will have an abundance of sessions on a variety of topics for all content areas. I hope you will join us at the Teacher Leader Summit. I'm sure you will find sessions that support your own professional learning goals!

Those students who are still below benchmark from the BOY window should continue with their reading plan as well. Parents should be notified within 30 days of screening to review their child's plan. Interventions, as well as progress monitoring, should continue through the next screening window which begins April 1 for EOY.

SUPPORT FOR DIVERSE LEARNERS

State Special Education Advisory Panel Application Open

The LDOE is looking for individuals interested in serving on the state's Special Education Advisory Panel (SEAP), which advises and assists the LDOE with the provision of free and appropriate public education for individuals with disabilities across the state. Members of SEAP represent public and private sectors that, by virtue of their position, interest, or training, can contribute information in regard to the education of students with disabilities. Fifty-one percent of the members must be parents of a child with a disability (ages birth through 26) or individuals with disabilities. Kindergarten Dyslexia Screening

<u>ACT 266</u> requires teachers to screen all kindergarten students for dyslexia during the second half of the school year or upon request of a parent/guardian or teacher. Please review the following timeline to learn more about this process.

February:

• The LDOE will finalize the procurement process for a statewide kindergarten administration of the Shaywitz DyslexiaScreen.

March:

- The LDOE will send rosters to special education directors.
- Special education directors will share rosters with site leaders.
- Site leaders will set up screenings at the class level.
- LDOE will provide a live one-hour training for kindergarten teachers with general information on dyslexia and the administration of the screener.

April:

Kindergarten teachers will screen all kindergarten students. (All screening is to be completed by the end
of April.)

May:

At-risk results are reported to parents or guardians within 30 days of screener completion.

Louisiana History Professional Development Opportunity
