My name is Rusti Nelson and I am a kindergarten teacher at Valverda Elementary School in Pointe Coupee Parish. I have been teaching for six years. My favorite thing about my role as an early childhood educator is that I get to jumpstart the reading journey for my students.

The growth I see in my students from the beginning of the year to the end is astounding. The K-3 Literacy Screener, which is a universal screener that identifies students who may be at risk for experiencing reading difficulties, is a key contributor to that success. Teachers use the data from the screener to set and monitor literacy goals, as well as provide instructional support. My beginning of the year (BOY) to middle of the year (MOY) DIBELS <u>literacy screener</u> results in Phoneme Segmentation Fluency (PSF) grew from 28% of my students at or above benchmark to 89% at or above benchmark. Using the DIBELS screener, I have been able to monitor the progress and pinpoint the needs of each of my students. Phoneme segmentation is a priority skill that my co-teachers and I progress monitor to determine who needs just-in-time supports and

who has mastered the targeted skill. Based on that knowledge, we are able to make our science of reading (SOR) intervention groups and address the specific areas of support our students need, as well as differentiate our core instruction to better personalize it for our students.

The data teachers obtain from the DIBELS screener is a gold mine of information! Teachers are able to determine what specific skills their students need improvement in and then use that data to help their students achieve mastery of those skills.

As the youngest learners in Louisiana begin their journey to becoming successful readers, I know with resources like the literacy screener available to teachers, we can make all the difference.
